CHRISTENSEN: In January. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: In January? MR. CHRISTENSEN: Yes. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Do you have did you receive it by email form, in mail? MR. CHRISTENSEN: No, we just met. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: You just met. MR. HARRISON: We met at the CPA's office and she gave it to him. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: And has a closing date been established? MR. CHRISTENSEN: No, because we were aware

regulated? And if we do it under the SMA type of process, those don't -- systems don't need to be regulated. Now, we understand the other two do and that's not a problem. But this being a smaller one, private ownership, it's like, do we need to have this one regulated? So we're waiting to kind of see what's happening here at this meeting.

The meeting was supposed to be here earlier this month, and due to his problem with the breakage on his system, we weren't able to have that meeting. So we've just kind of been delayed here, waiting to see what's going on.

JUDGE DOROSHKIN: I will not be issuing any additional bench requests or have any other questions for you, Mr. Christensen. We'll have an opportunity now for closing statements.

Mr. Fukano, would you like to summarize
Staff's recommendation or make a closing statement?
MR. FUKANO: Yes. And Staff has reviewed
the materials submitted by Mr. Harrison and have
determined that there are 46 customers listed in the
materials.

MR. HARRISON: How do you get 46 and I'm only collecting from 39?

MS. PAUL: The paperwork that you submitted

Furthermore, WAC 480-100-235 defines control as meaning the water system operator or manger has discretion over the property or finances or operations of a water system which is normally exercised by an owner.

You've heard testimony today from Mr. Harrison that he does manage all of the water systems. Staff has also presented evidence that Sunrise Acres is a water company owned and controlled by Tom Harrison, and that Mr. Harrison owns and controls two additional water systems; Harrison-Ray Water Company and Harrison Water Company/Kiona through Secretary of State and Department of Health records.

Staff contends that Mr. Harrison controls
Harrison-Ray, Harrison/Kiona, and Sunrise Acres in the
capacity as governor of those companies as reflected in
the Secretary of State records, and that Mr. Harrison
owns Harrison-Ray, Harrison/Kiona, and Sunrise Acres as
reflected in the Department of Health records.

Harrison-Ray is organized as a corporation and Harrison/Kiona and Sunrise Acres are both limited-liability corporations. RCW 23B.01.400(19) of the Washington Business Corporation Act states that the

shows a total of 46 customers, although one is vacant. So that would be 45 active customers --

MR. HARRISON: There's still only 39 lots in the system.

MS. PAUL: I'm sorry, this is the report -(Multiple speakers.)

MS. PAUL: -- you handed to us.

MR. HARRISON: -- on the billing. I don't know what, you know, a dead account. I didn't review it like that, but there's truly only 39 lots. Whatever.

MR. FUKANO: RCW 80.04.010(30) states that a water company is subject to Commission jurisdiction if the company has over 100 customers. RCW 80.04.010(30)(b) further states that when measuring how many customers a water company has, the measurement must include all portions of water companies having common ownership or control regardless of location or corporate designation.

This statute means that the Commission is required to include all customers from water companies that have the same owner or controller when determining how many customers a water company has.

To interpret this provision in another manner, would allow companies to artificially compartmentalize water company operations to avoid

term "governor" has the same meaning as provided in RCW 23.95.0 -- 0 -- 105, a provision in the Uniform Business Organizations Code.

According to that statute, a governor in the context of a for-profit corporation such as Harrison-Ray is a director. According to the same statute, in the context of a limited-liability company such as Harrison/Kiona and Sunrise Acres, a governor is a member of a member-managed limited-liability company. Therefore, according to the Secretary of State records provided by Staff, Mr. Harrison is the sole director of Harrison-Ray and is the sole managing member of Harrison/Kiona and Sunrise Acres.

Therefore, Staff asserts that Mr. Harrison controls Sunrise Acres, Harrison-Ray, and Harrison/Kiona. Staff has also presented evidence that Harrison-Ray Water Company and Harrison Water Company/Kiona each have over 200 customers.

Finally, Staff has testified that Sunrise
Acres has not filed a tariff with the Commission. RCW
80.25.050 requires a jurisdictional water company to
file a tariff with the Commission. Therefore, Staff
asks the Commission to determine that Sunrise Acres is a
water company that is subject to the Commission's
jurisdiction because it exceeds the 100 customer
