I serve on the Board of Directors of the Northwest Justice Project (NJP), a not-forprofit statewide organization that provides free civil legal services to low-income people. On April 26, 2003, it came to my attention that Mr. Ronald Roseman, counsel for the AARP in this matter, is a part-time employee of NJP, serving as the organization's Public Affairs Coordinator. Nor does AARP fund or receive funds from NJP.

As a member of NJP's Board of Directors, I do not supervise Mr. Roseman's work product. Nor do I control or otherwise influence in any manner the legal services he provides his personal clients. I have not discussed the subject matter of this litigation with Mr. Roseman, nor has he provided me any documents, information or material related to this matter.

The purpose of this letter is to inform the parties of this relationship and offer an opportunity to comment. I believe that the fact that Mr. Roseman is an employee of NJP has not and will not influence my decision in this matter, or affect my judgment in any manner.
