One of the primary issues in these proceedings is the effect, if any, of the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) decision on compensation for Internet Service Provider (ISP)-bound traffic issued on November 5, 2008, in response to a writ of mandamus granted by the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia (D.C. Circuit). The FCC's *ISP Mandamus Order* is now pending on appeal before the D.C. Circuit. There is also pending before the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals an appeal by Level 3 Communications, LLC (Level 3), of a decision by the Arizona Corporations Commission addressing compensation for ISP-bound traffic.
