Further to the Company's response to WUTC Data Request 153 dated October 2, 2023, and without waiving the objections idientified in that previous response, the Company provides the following additional response:

On July 27, 2023, the Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals issued an order¹ that stays the enforcement of the Ozone Transport Rule (OTR) in Utah pending the outcome of ongoing litigation. Based on that order and the continuing uncertainty around Wyoming, the Company agrees—based on information known at the time that this response was prepared—that <u>all Company plants</u> (not just the Jim Bridger plant) are not subject to the OTR in the calendar year 2024 test period.

The Company notes that the impact to Washington net power costs (NPC) is different when considering the removal of the OTR from <u>all Company plants</u>, as compared to selectively removing the OTR from only one plant, or only one state.

The Company further notes that the Alliance of Western Energy Consumers' (AWEC) consultant, Bradley G. Mullins, agrees with this position based on AWEC's testimony filed in Oregon on August 16, 2023² and AWEC's testimony filed in Wyoming on August 14, 2023.³
