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1 PROCEEDINGS JUDGE CLARK: Good afternoon. 2 It's 3 approximately 1:30 p.m., September 16th, 2009, in the 4 Commission's hearing room in Olympia, Washington. This 5 is the time and the place set for a prehearing б conference in the matter of the application for solid 7 waste authority filed by Northwest Liquid Transport I, 8 Inc., given docket number TG-091026, Patricia Clark, 9 administrative law judge for the Commission presiding. 10 This matter came before the Commission on 11 June 26th, 2009, when Northwest Liquid Transport filed 12 an application for a certificate of public convenience 13 and necessity to operate motor vehicles in furnishing solid waste collection services under contract with 14 15 Nature's Path Food, USA, Inc., located in Blaine, 16 Washington, to collect and transport for disposal a 17 mixture of sugar water and solids from the plant in 18 Whatcom County. Notice of the application was published in the Commission's weekly docket of July 19 20 9th, 2009. 21 On August 7th, 2009, Vanderveen Family Transport filed a protest to the application. On 22 23 August 10th, 2009, Sanitary Service Company, 24 Incorporated, and Blaine-Bay Refuse, Incorporated, each filed a protest to the application. On August 18th, 25

2009, the Commission issued a notice of prehearing
 conference scheduling the conference for this date and
 time.

4 At this juncture, I would like to take 5 appearances on behalf of the parties. I would like to 6 start first with Northwest Liquid Transport. Northwest 7 Liquid Transport is appearing telephonically for this 8 afternoon's prehearing conference, so I would like to 9 inform everyone that you might need to speak a little 10 more loudly and slowly than you would ordinarily speak. 11 MS. STARKENBURG-KROONTJE: Lesa 12 Starkenburg-Kroontje is appearing today on behalf of 13 Northwest Liquid Transport One, Inc. 14 JUDGE CLARK: Appearing on behalf of Sanitary 15 Service and Blaine-Bay Refuse? 16 MS. MCNEILL: Thank you, Your Honor. This is 17 Polly L. McNeill with Summit Law Group representing 18 Sanitary Service Company, Inc., and Blaine-Bay Refuse, Inc. Would you like our addresses or phone or e-mail 19 for the record, or do you have that information 20 21 already? 22 JUDGE CLARK: Actually, I have all of that information and can provide that to the court reporter 23 24 for including in the transcript of this afternoon's

25 proceeding, but thank you for the offer.

1 The record should also reflect that on 2 September 9th, the Commission received from Vanderveen 3 Family Transport notice of the withdrawal of their 4 protest, and by an electronic e-mail from the presiding 5 officer, I advised Vanderveen Family Transport that 6 they need not enter an appearance at this afternoon's 7 prehearing conference.

8 The final party appearing this afternoon 9 would be the Commission's regulatory staff.

MR. FASSIO: Thank you, Your Honor. Michael
Fassio, assistant attorney general appearing on behalf
of Commission staff.

13 JUDGE CLARK: Thank you. The Commission has before it at this juncture a proposed amendment filed 14 15 by Northwest Liquid Transport, and 16 Ms. Starkenburg-Kroontje, maybe we could start there 17 with the initial amendment that was proposed by the 18 applicant, and then perhaps we can discuss the 19 modification to that filed by Sanitary Services and 20 Blaine Bay.

21 MS. STARKENBURG-KROONTJE: Well, the initial 22 application that was submitted to the Commission 23 contained the language that you read into the record 24 just a few moments ago, and then on September 10th, 25 2009, through a transmittal to the Commission, we

proposed on behalf of Northwest Liquid Transport to
 amend the language in an effort to facilitate
 withdrawal of the protests filed by Sanitary Service
 Company and Blaine-Bay Refuse.

5 After further communication with their 6 counsel, we proposed a second amendment to the initial 7 filing which then would replace the amendment that we 8 proposed on September 10. That second amendment was by letter dated September 15th, 2009. That second 9 10 amendment contains language -- I can either read the 11 whole thing into the record or just speak to the change 12 process, because the change first and then see if you 13 want me to read the entire thing into the record, but basically the transport of the sugar water and the 14 15 solids would be by internal or external vacuum system 16 into a tanker truck, and so the authority request would 17 be limited to that loading and transport system. Would 18 you like me to read the entire amended language then 19 into the record?

20 JUDGE CLARK: I think that would be a good 21 idea.

22 MS. STARKENBURG-KROONTJE: The request for 23 authority would be amended to read as follows: Solid 24 waste collection services under contract with Nature's 25 Path Food, USA, Inc., located in Blaine, Washington, to

collect and transport for disposal a mixture of sugar
 water and solids using an internal or external vacuum
 system to load and transport by tanker truck in Whatcom
 County.

5 JUDGE CLARK: Thank you. Ms. McNeill? б MS. MCNEILL: Thank you, Your Honor, and 7 thank you to Ms. Starkenburg-Kroontje for reading that. 8 We have been in communication with the Applicant and 9 with Staff in the last couple of weeks to try to come 10 up with an amended authority that would provide 11 Northwest Liquids with the authority that they need to 12 perform the service and minimize the risk that any 13 future certificate holders could use it to transport solid waste in a manner that would interfere and 14 15 overlap with my two client's authorities, and I 16 apologize to you, Your Honor, as well as to Staff, and 17 I thank very much the Applicant and Staff for working 18 with me while I was on vacation, and that is the only reason, I think, that as of yesterday when I returned, 19 we were able to finally come up with some language that 20 21 does give Northwest Liquids the authority that they need to perform the services and addresses any concerns 22 23 that my clients, Sanitary Service and Blaine-Bay 24 Refuse, have.

So if the Commission is willing to accept the

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1 amendment as proposed in the letter that was sent yesterday, September 15th, then we are willing to 2 3 withdraw our protest as well. 4 JUDGE CLARK: That concluded your comments 5 regarding the amendment, Ms. McNeill? MS. MCNEILL: That's correct. б 7 JUDGE CLARK: Mr. Fassio? 8 MR. FASSIO: Thank you. The Staff did have 9 an opportunity to be privy to the discussions between 10 the Applicant and the Protestants here and did have an 11 opportunity to review the language that was proposed, 12 and the amendment is acceptable to Staff, and Staff has 13 no concerns and would support the request to amend. 14 JUDGE CLARK: So we now have an application 15 for the amended authority, which is unopposed by any 16 protest and which is amenable to Staff, so I believe 17 that we can handle this matter administratively without 18 having any evidentiary hearing or further proceedings 19 in this matter; is that correct? 20 MS. STARKENBURG-KROONTJE: That would appear 21 correct to the Applicant. 22 MS. MCNEILL: That's my understanding as 23 well, Your Honor. 24 MR. FASSIO: Staff's understanding as well, 25 Your Honor.

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1 JUDGE CLARK: Is there any further matter that should be considered on the record this afternoon? 2 3 MS. STARKENBURG-KROONTJE: Not from the 4 Applicant. 5 MS. MCNEILL: Not from the Protestants б either. 7 MR. FASSIO: Your Honor, if you could maybe 8 perhaps clarify for the parties administratively, would 9 this be handled through an initial order? How would 10 this be resolved administratively, do you believe? 11 JUDGE CLARK: That's an excellent question, 12 Mr. Fassio, and I have to tell you honestly I'm not 13 really sure because this has never ever happened before, so what I intend to do following this 14 15 afternoon's prehearing conference is to consult with 16 the director of the administrative law division, and I 17 was unable to do that this morning, and inquire what is 18 the best way for us to proceed, but in any event, it appears, whether it's an initial order, exactly what 19 form that order would take, the Commission will be 20 21 issuing an order basically approving the application based on the authority requested in the second 22 23 amendment, but procedurally exactly how I will effect 24 that particular process, I am unsure at this juncture. 25 Are there any other questions that I am

unable to answer? If you have a question I know the answer to, it is not appropriate to ask at this time. Are there any other matters to consider, Mr. Fassio? MR. FASSIO: No. JUDGE CLARK: Hearing nothing, we are б adjourned. (Prehearing adjourned at 1:42 p.m.)
