SECTION 63.71 APPLICATION

CenturyLink¹ hereby applies for authority pursuant to Section 63.71 of the Federal

Communications Commission's (Commission) rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, and Section 214 of the

Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 214, to grandfather its Enterprise SIP

Trunking (ESIP) service in all states and jurisdictions where the service is offered. CenturyLink

ultimately plans to discontinue these services but is not seeking authority to do so at this time.

CenturyLink submits the following information in support of its application:

1. Name and address of carrier

2. Date of planned service discontinuance

As of March 20, 2020, or as soon thereafter as the necessary regulatory approvals can be obtained, CenturyLink will no longer offer ESIP service to new customers nor accept new orders from existing customers (except to the extent such orders are permitted by contract). Existing customers of these services will be grandfathered as follows:

- Existing contracts for these services will not be renewed.
- Customers with a contract may retain affected services on a month-to-month basis once that contract expires.

3. Points of geographic areas of service affected

CenturyLink seeks authority to grandfather the provision of ESIP service in Alabama, Arkansas, Arizona, California, Colorado, Connecticut, the District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, Nebraska, New Jersey, New Mexico, Nevada, New York, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Virginia, Washington, and Wisconsin.

4. Brief description of the type of services affected

Enterprise SIP Trunking is a Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) service that allows the sharing of SIP call paths across two redundant IP-PBX platforms and provides bi-directional Business Continuity and Disaster Recovery functionality.

CenturyLink is grandfathering ESIP service because the service is at the end of its product life cycle, as the equipment associated with this service has been discontinued by the manufacturer and is no longer supported.

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The public convenience and necessity will not be adversely affected by the grandfathering of the services described herein. No other products or services are impacted by this application.

5. Brief description of the dates and methods of notice to all affected customers

CenturyLink notified its customers of the plan to grandfather ESIP service in a letter sent via U.S. Mail on January 27, 2020. Those customers were notified that the proposed grandfathering would take effect on March 20, 2020, or as soon after that date as authorized by the relevant regulatory commissions. A copy of the customer notification letter is appended hereto. (*See* Attachment A.)

6. Dominance of carrier with respect to the service to be grandfathered

CenturyLink is a non-dominant carrier with regard to the services to be grandfathered.

7. Service

In accordance with 47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a), CenturyLink has mailed a copy of this application to the Governor and public utility commission of each affected state identified in

Paragraph 3 above, to any federally-recognized Tribal Nations with authority over the Tribal lands in the geographic areas identified in Paragraph 3 above, as well as to the Special Assistant for Telecommunications under the Secretary of Defense².
