TO ALL PARTIES OF RECORD:

This matter has been pending for some time, continued at the Parties' requests to permit the opportunity for preparation and filing of a comprehensive settlement agreement. Despite the passage of several months since the last status conference, and the Parties' assurances that the terms of a comprehensive settlement had been agreed and shortly would be reduced to writing, no such settlement agreement has been filed.

Indefinite continuances are disfavored by the Commission and typically are allowed only when parties represent that a settlement filing or other potentially dispositive action is imminent, but will require an uncertain number of days to complete. When the Commission granted an indefinite continuance in this proceeding, it relied on the Parties' representations that a settlement agreement would be filed within a reasonable period. That has not occurred.

ALL PARTIES PLEASE TAKE NOTICE That a Status Conference will be convened in this proceeding on Thursday, September 20, 2001, beginning at 9:30 a.m., in the Commission's Hearing Room 206, Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive SW, Olympia, Washington. If the Parties file a settlement agreement prior to the status conference, the conference will be treated as a prehearing conference to determine what further process, if any, is appropriate to conclude this proceeding. If the Parties do not file a settlement agreement prior to the status conference, the conference will be treated as a prehearing conference to determine what further process is required to conclude this proceeding and to establish a procedural schedule, including dates for evidentiary and other hearing proceedings.
