Today is Thursday, October 14th, 2021, and the 8 time is approximately 10:00 a.m. 9 My name is Samantha Doyle, and I'm the administrative law judge presiding over today's hearing. 10 This is Docket TG-210102, which is a special 11 12 proceeding to determine whether Cascade Recycling Incorporated is operating as a solid waste company 13 without the required permit from the Commission. 14 15 Let's take quick appearances starting with 16 Commission Staff. 17 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: On behalf of Commission Staff, this is Jennifer Cameron-Rulkowski, 18 19 Assistant Attorney General, and my contact information is listed in Order 01. 20 21 JUDGE DOYLE: And for the company? 22 MR. JOHNS: I'm Mike Johns. I'm the 23 attorney for Cascade Recycling. 24 JUDGE DOYLE: And your information was filed 25 with the Commission as well with your appearance?

- 1 MR. JOHNS: That's correct. It was
- 2 yesterday, Your Honor.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Great, thank you.
- And as we just stated off the record, I
- 5 believe Staff and the company would like to have a short
- 6 break to have a quick discussion. So we will be off the
- 7 record and return -- is ten minutes enough? Or do you
- 8 want to message me when you're ready, a member of Staff
- 9 message me?
- 10 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: What I would
- 11 propose, Your Honor, is that we plan to come back on the
- 12 record and provide a status update at 10:30 if that's --
- if that's acceptable to the company.
- MR. JOHNS: That's fine with me.
- MR. DOLMSETH: Yes, thank you.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Okay. Great. So with that,
- 17 we'll be off the record, returning at 10:30 for a status
- 18 update. Thank you.
- 19 (A break was taken from
- 20 10:04 a.m. to 10:31 a.m.)
- JUDGE DOYLE: Let's return to the record
- 22 and check in with Staff for a status update from the
- 23 break. Thank you.
- 24 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you, Your
- 25 Honor. We had a productive discussion with the company,

- 1 and it looks like we can go ahead and proceed to have
- 2 some further discussion and potentially negotiate a
- 3 settlement. We don't know if that's what we will
- 4 eventually come to through the discussion, but we would
- 5 like to have the opportunity to do that and would
- 6 propose rescheduling this hearing for about three weeks
- 7 out depending on your -- your availability.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Okay. Great.
- 9 Generally speaking, I like to give a little
- 10 more time than three weeks. Are the parties amenable to
- 11 looking more like a month and a half out?
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: It would be my
- 13 preference to conclude this before the Thanksgiving
- 14 week.
- 15 JUDGE DOYLE: Okay. And does the company
- 16 agree?
- MR. JOHNS: Yes, I'm open to whatever will
- 18 work so -- and if it turns out -- I was looking at my
- 19 third week of November, and other than the 19th, I'm
- 20 pretty good the third week of November as well.
- 21 MR. DOLMSETH: Can you hear me? Can you
- 22 hear me?
- JUDGE DOYLE: Yes.
- MR. DOLMSETH: I just was going to say I've
- 25 been very thankful for your understanding and Kathryn as

- 1 well. Post COVID, I've been able to get a lot of
- 2 procedures looked at that was on the shelf, and I think
- 3 we're on the right path, but I still have a grafted
- 4 wound in my leg, and there's -- we're not done with it.
- 5 And I just say if that goes the wrong way, I may have to
- 6 come back and seek some additional time, but it's really
- 7 looking good right now. I'm grateful for that. So
- 8 anyways.
- 9 JUDGE DOYLE: Thank you. Appreciate that.
- 10 Okay. So looking at -- so looking at
- 11 November, how does the week of the 15th look to the
- 12 parties?
- MR. JOHNS: You're on mute, Jennifer.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you. Except
- 15 for the afternoon of Monday, the 15th, I'm generally
- 16 available. I would like to ask my -- I would like to
- 17 ask my witnesses about their availability that week.
- Ms. McPherson and Mr. Perkinson, can you
- 19 chime in, please?
- 20 MR. PERKINSON: Yeah, just taking a look at
- 21 the calendar. The only strongholds that I have are the
- 22 17th, 9:30 to noon. And looks like Thursday, 9:00 to
- 23 noon as well. I can be available any other time that
- 24 week.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you,

- 1 Mr. Perkinson.
- 2 Ms. McPherson?
- 3 MS. MCPHERSON: I am available or can
- 4 reschedule anything that week.
- 5 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you.
- 6 MR. JOHNS: And my only problem is the
- 7 morning of the 19th.
- 8 JUDGE DOYLE: Okay. So does the morning of
- 9 either the 15th or 16th work? We could do 9:00 a.m. on
- 10 the 16th, would that work for the parties?
- 11 MR. JOHNS: That works for me.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: That works for
- 13 Staff.
- MR. DOLMSETH: Yes.
- 15 JUDGE DOYLE: Okay. Great. Well, then at
- 16 this point, we will reschedule and send out a notice for
- 17 9:00 a.m. on the 16th rescheduling this proceeding. And
- 18 with that, is there any other business before we adjourn
- 19 for today?
- 20 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Not from Commission
- 21 Staff, Your Honor.
- 22 MR. JOHNS: And not from Cascade, Your
- 23 Honor.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Okay. Well, thank you,
- 25 everyone, for coming here today, and we are adjourned.
