Dear Commissioners:

On behalf of the Washington BlueGreen Alliance, thank you for convening a special meeting to discuss the COVID-19 pandemic and its impacts on Washington ratepayers. We are extremely grateful for the opportunity to comment on Docket #U-20028.

The Washington BlueGreen Alliance is a coalition of labor unions and environmental organizations committed to solving today's environmental challenges in ways that create and maintain quality jobs and build a stronger, fairer economy. At present, our top priority is addressing the immediate needs of working families and our state's most vulnerable citizens.

COVID-19 is as much a social and economic crisis as it is a public health crisis. We are experiencing unemployment levels unseen since the Great Depression. Although this economic disruption is partly the result of the closures necessary to respond to the pandemic, it has been hugely exacerbated by our unjust economic system. Pervasive low-wage, unstable work with inadequate paid leave and poor health coverage has yielded a large number of working poor individuals and families living paycheck to paycheck that are highly vulnerable to crises like COVID-19.

As Washington rebuilds in the wake of the pandemic, we have an obligation to advance a fairer, more resilient economy by incentivizing high-road job creation and pushing back on regressive policies that have enhanced corporate power and exacerbated income inequality. However, working people and families in Washington cannot wait for long-term structural change—we need action now.
