Response to PC Data Request 232

The Company has not considered additional modifications to the low income bill assistance (LIBA) program outside what has been proposed in the direct testimony of Company witness, Robert M. Meredith (Exhibit RMM-1T) for this case. The Company has been meeting with its Low Income Advisory Committee and has received positive feedback on the program changes that went into effect in late 2021. The Company has been discussing the pros and cons of a self-attestation model with the advisory group, but does not plan to propose any modifications to change the income qualification process at this time.
