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PROCEEDINGS 1 2 JUDGE RENDAHL: Good afternoon. I'm Ann 3 Rendahl, the administrative law judge presiding over 4 this proceeding. We are here before the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission on Monday, 5 October the 10th, 2005, for a prehearing conference in 6 Docket No. TC-051063, which is an application for an 7 8 auto transportation company or bus certificate filed by 9 Gateway Shuttle Service, Incorporated. 10 The purpose of the prehearing this afternoon 11 is to take appearances of the parties, to discuss the 12 schedule for the Commission's consideration of the 13 prick and any other procedural matters. So before we 14 go any farther, let's take appearances from the 15 parties, and if you could please state your full name, 16 the party you represent, your full address, telephone 17 number, fax number, and e-mail address, and we will 18 start with the Applicant, Mr. Porter. MR. PORTER: The name is Jeffrey L. Porter. 19 20 I'm the applicant for Gateway Shuttle Service. My 21 telephone number is (509) 307-4145. A fax number would 22 be (360) 417-5050. My e-mail address is 23 jport@3dnorth.com. My mailing address is 901 Filan Road, Colfax, Washington, 99111. 24 25 JUDGE RENDAHL: Now, I have on some of the

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letters that have come in, there is a PO Box in 1 2 Carlsborg, Washington, so would you prefer we use the 3 901 Filan Road address? 4 MR. PORTER: No. That's my home address. I would prefer all the correspondence go to that post 5 office box in Carlsborg. 6 7 JUDGE RENDAHL: So if I put on the address here, PO Box 883, Carlsborg, Washington, 98324, that 8 9 will work for our purposes? 10 MR. PORTER: Yes. That's the address for 11 Linda Yip, who will be the business manager. She ran 12 the business for me when I had it. 13 JUDGE RENDAHL: Thank you. Mr. Rice? 14 MR. RICE: Yes. Good afternoon, Your Honor. 15 I'm David Rice. I represent Evergreen Trails, Inc., 16 and Shuttle Express, Inc. I am with Miller Nash, LLP. 17 Our address is 4400 Two Union Square, 601 Union Street, 18 Seattle, Washington, 98101. My phone number is (206) 777-7424. My fax is (206) 622-7485. My e-mail 19 20 address is david.rice@millernash.com. 21 JUDGE RENDAHL: So your phone number is 22 (206) 777-7424? 23 MR. RICE: That's correct. 24 JUDGE RENDAHL: Mr. Heckman? 25 MR. HECKMAN: Jack Heckman for Olympic Bus

12	JUDGE RENDAHL: Thank you. So moving on to			
13	the good of the order here, does anybody see a need for			
14	invoking the discovery rule in this proceeding?			
15	MR. PORTER: I'm not familiar with what you			
16	are talking about.			
17	JUDGE RENDAHL: The Commission has procedural			
18	rules governing different proceedings, and the basic			
19	discovery rules are subpoenas, but if you want more			
20	than that in terms of data requests or interrogatories			
21	or questions that you might send in writing to the			
22	other party, those are used when you invoke the			
23	discovery rule. We don't normally do that in these			
24	types of proceedings, but it's an issue we cover in the			
25	prehearing. My sense is it's not necessary in this			

case, but I'm asking it just to make sure. 1 2 MR. PORTER: I don't think it's necessary. 3 JUDGE RENDAHL: Any other party? 4 MR. HECKMAN: I don't think so either. MR. RICE: I don't think it's necessary. 5 JUDGE RENDAHL: Thank you. And likewise, I 6 don't see a need for a protective order either. I 7 don't think there is any confidential information 8 9 that's likely to be disseminated in this proceeding. 10 So really, the remaining issue is the 11 procedural schedule, and we talked off the record about 12 timing for a hearing. Mr. Porter and Mr. Heckman agree 13 that the hearing itself would probably take no more 14 than an hour and no party, Mr. Porter, Mr. Heckman, 15 Mr. Rice, or Staff, is at this time planning on any 16 witnesses; although I'm assuming, Mr. Porter, you would put on a case for your application. 17 18 MR. PORTER: Correct. The only person that 19 would possibly accompany would be Linda Yip. 20 JUDGE RENDAHL: So you might put on Linda Yip 21 in addition to yourself? 22 MR. PORTER: Correct. 23 MR. RICE: I'm assuming we can reach a settlement to get my clients out of this case, but if 24 for some reason that were not possible, we would 25

probably put forward one witness for each, Evergreen Trails and for Shuttle Express. So I'm hoping that by saying that we feel strongly that we will be able to reach a settlement, I don't want to preclude our right to participate in the hearing if that proves to be necessary. Is that okay?

7 JUDGE RENDAHL: I don't see that as a 8 problem. In our discussions off the record, we 9 identified a day of November 8th as the best day for 10 hearing, and even though Mr. Porter and Mr. Heckman 11 have estimated just an hour for the hearing, I intend 12 to reserve the entire day in the off chance we need it, 13 which would allow us time if we don't settle to bring 14 in your witnesses.

15 MR. RICE: I understand. Thank you.

JUDGE RENDAHL: So my plan is to send out in 16 the prehearing conference order a notice of hearing for 17 18 November 8th. Now, prior to the hearing, if any party 19 is planning on presenting any evidence at the hearing, 20 I would like to identify a date by which the parties 21 will exchange with each other and notify the Commission 22 of any witnesses, the names and the titles of the 23 witnesses that they plan to have appear at the hearing 24 as well as exchange any documents they plan to use in 25 evidence at the hearing. It will help the hearing

proceed and there will be no surprise at the hearing. So usually a week before the hearing is an appropriate time, unless you think differently. That would make it Tuesday, November the 1st, to exchange that information with each other and to notify the Commission.

7 MR. PORTER: That's fine. 8 JUDGE RENDAHL: Does that not work for 9 anyone? Hearing nothing, then we will have an exchange 10 of information on the 1st with the hearing on the 8th. 11 Does any party wish to file briefs in this matter? Do 12 you want to make some kind of closing statement at the 13 hearing in lieu of a brief? What is your preference? 14 I'll begin with you, Mr. Porter.

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MR. PORTER: I guess...

JUDGE RENDAHL: When I say "brief," since you are representing yourself, it would just be a summary of the evidence and why you are entitled to the application.

20 MR. PORTER: And that's all I intend to 21 submit.

22 JUDGE RENDAHL: Would you do that after the 23 hearing?

24 MR. PORTER: Yes.25 JUDGE RENDAHL: About how much time would you

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need after the hearing? MR. PORTER: Five minutes. 2 3 JUDGE RENDAHL: So would you plan on making a 4 written statement or a verbal statement? 5 MR. PORTER: A verbal statement. JUDGE RENDAHL: So you would prefer to make 6 7 sort of closing statements as opposed to writing 8 something up? 9 MR. PORTER: Yes. 10 JUDGE RENDAHL: Mr. Rice? This is assuming 11 you don't reach some sort of agreement. 12 MR. RICE: If we don't reach an agreement, I 13 would prefer to see something written. 14 JUDGE RENDAHL: Okay. And Mr. Heckman, what 15 would be your preference? 16 MR. HECKMAN: I think that mine is also just going to be verbal. 17 JUDGE RENDAHL: And Mr. Swanson? 18 MR. SWANSON: Staff doesn't have a 19 20 preference. Staff is happy to go with briefs or with a 21 verbal statements. 22 JUDGE RENDAHL: What we can do is reserve 23 discussion on that, and if, Mr. Rice, your clients manage to resolve the issues with Mr. Porter, then I 24 25 think we could just go forward with some brief closing

statements at the hearing, and if for some reason you 1 2 cannot resolve the issues, then we will decide the 3 issue of briefing rather than verbal statements at the 4 time of the hearing. Is that acceptable to everybody? 5 MR. PORTER: It is to Mr. Porter. 6 MR. RICE: It is acceptable to me. JUDGE RENDAHL: I'm assuming I heard from you 7 too, Mr. Heckman, that that's fine? 8 9 MR. HECKMAN: That's true. 10 JUDGE RENDAHL: So in terms of filing with 11 the Commission, and this will also be included in the 12 prehearing conference order, I have looked over the list of staff who are receiving copies of what's filed 13 14 in this case, and I've winnowed down the number of 15 copies that need to be filed to four. So when you file 16 documents in this case, you need to file an original so the records center has that original and then four 17 18 copies that will be distributed internally. 19 Is there anything else that we need to 20 discuss this afternoon or that I need to know before we 21 conclude the prehearing? 22 MR. PORTER: Not from Mr. Porter. 23 MR. HECKMAN: Not from Mr. Heckman. 24 JUDGE RENDAHL: Is there anyone who wishes to 25 order a copy of the transcript of this afternoon's

proceeding? 1 MR. RICE: No, I don't need a copy. 2 MR. PORTER: No. 3 4 MR. HECKMAN: No. 5 JUDGE RENDAHL: I will prepare a prehearing conference order that will include a summary of what 6 we've talked about this afternoon as well as a schedule 7 for the hearing, and I will look forward to seeing all 8 9 of you on November 8th unless I hear otherwise, and 10 this prehearing conference is adjourned, so thank you 11 very much for calling in. 12 MR. PORTER: One question. Is this going to 13 be held in Olympia there? 14 JUDGE RENDAHL: Unless you all would prefer a 15 different location. 16 MR. SWANSON: I'm glad you raised that question because Staff actually did weigh in thinking 17 18 that it would be in Clallam or Jefferson County, but I forgot to mention that as well. 19 20 JUDGE RENDAHL: If it makes sense, 21 considering that you are up there, Mr. Porter, and 22 Mr. Heckman, you are in that area --23 MR. PORTER: I'm an over-the-road driver. 24 I'm in all 14 states, so I would have to make plans to 25 be in a particular place at a particular time.

JUDGE RENDAHL: So why don't we plan, and I 1 2 will have my assistant, one of my assistants, look at 3 possible locations in Port Angeles. Would that be the 4 best location? 5 MR. PORTER: That's fine. б JUDGE RENDAHL: So we will see if we can find a hearing location in Port Angeles. What we usually do 7 8 is find public buildings that we can hold a hearing in 9 so that there is no cost, so we will look into that. 10 At this point, plan for Port Angeles unless I let you 11 all know, Port Angeles on November 8th. It will start 12 at 9:30 and go until we are done. 13 MR. PORTER: That's fine. Thank you very 14 much. 15 JUDGE RENDAHL: Are there any other issues we 16 need to talk about before we adjourn? 17 MR. PORTER: Not on my part. 18 JUDGE RENDAHL: Hearing nothing, this 19 prehearing conference is adjourned. Thank you very 20 much for calling in, and I will send out the order 21 either this afternoon or tomorrow. Thank you very 22 much. 23 (Prehearing conference concluded at 1:51 p.m.) 24 25
