- NATURE OF PROCEEDINGS: On June 13, 2011, Puget Sound Energy, Inc. (PSE), filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) certain tariff revisions designed to increase rates for electrical and natural gas services provided to customers in Washington. The tariff revisions, if allowed to become effective, would increase rates to recover additional revenues of approximately 8.1 percent for electrical services and 3.0 percent for natural gas services. The Commission suspended operation of the as-filed tariffs by Order 01 entered in these dockets following the June 30, 2011, open meeting.¹
- 2 **CONFERENCE/PRESIDING OFFICERS.** The Commission convened a prehearing conference in this proceeding at Olympia, Washington on July 20, 2011, before Administrative Law Judge Dennis J. Moss, whom the Commission appoints as presiding officer in this proceeding.

- 5 **PETITIONS FOR INTERVENTION.** The following businesses and organizations filed petitions to intervene or petitioned orally:

ICNU The Energy Project

NWIGU Cost Management Services, Inc.

Kroger Company NWEC

Federal Executive Agencies Nucor Steel of Seattle, Inc.

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² In formal proceedings, such as this, the Commission's regulatory staff participates like any other party, while the Commissioners make the decision. To assure fairness, the Commissioners, the presiding administrative law judge, and the Commissioners' policy and accounting advisors do not discuss the merits of this proceeding with the regulatory staff, or nay other party, without giving notice and opportunity for all parties to participate. *See* RCW 34.05.455.

- PSE objected to the petition of Cost Management Services, Inc. (CMS), citing concerns regarding its competitive position in the industry. PSE's objection is overruled, there being appropriate means, including the protective order already entered in this proceeding, to give appropriate protections to commercially sensitive information. CMS demonstrated its substantial interest in this proceeding considering its role as agent for smaller industrial gas users who purchase services from PSE. Its petition to intervene is granted.
- There was no objection to the other petitions to intervene. The Commission finds that the petitioners each demonstrated their substantial interest in this proceeding and that their participation will be in the public interest. The petitions to intervene are granted.
- PROTECTIVE ORDER. The Commission entered Order 01 on June 17, 2011. Order 01 is a protective order under RCW 34.05.446, RCW 80.04.095, WAC 480-07-420 and WAC 480-07-423, entered in the interest of facilitating discovery.
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- PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE. Most parties agreed to a procedural schedule, which Staff presented for consideration. The Commission adopts this procedural schedule for the most part, as set forth in Appendix B to this Order, but acknowledges concerns expressed by Public Counsel on behalf of itself, NWEC and the Energy Project regarding the dates established for filing response testimony, and rebuttal and cross-answering testimony. These parties urged earlier dates, December 1, 2011, and January 6, 2012, respectively, for these filings.

- Procedural dates are deadlines. If parties find it more convenient to file their response testimonies earlier, they may do so. While the objecting parties may have less time than they consider ideal for any cross-answering testimony, this typically is limited in scope and can most likely be accomplished in the time available despite other obligations these parties face. On balance, the schedule proposed and agreed to by a majority of the parties appears workable, without causing prejudice to any party. The Commission will provide notice of any change in this schedule, in the event this is necessary to protect due process concerns or for other reasons.
- NOTICE OF HEARING. The Commission will hold evidentiary hearings in this matter beginning February 14, 2012, at 9:30 a.m., in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington. The Commission may alter this schedule by subsequent notice.
- PUBLIC COMMENT HEARINGS. The Commission will hold public comment hearings in this matter on dates and at times to be established by subsequent notice. The Commission will hold one such hearing during the course of the evidentiary proceedings to be conducted in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington during the period February 14-17, 2012.
- DOCUMENT PREPARATION AND FILING REQUIREMENTS. Parties must file the original plus eighteen (18) copies of the unredacted versions of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials. Parties must also file the original and one copy of any redacted version(s). These materials must conform to the format and publication guidelines in WAC 480-07-395 and WAC 480-07-460. The Commission prefers that materials be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.

- All filings must be mailed or delivered to the Executive Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by the U.S. Postal Service.
- An electronic copy of all filings must be provided through the Commission's Web Portal (www.utc.wa.gov/e-filing) or by e-mail delivery to (records@utc.wa.gov). Alternatively, parties may furnish an electronic copy by delivering with each filing a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette or CD including the filed document(s). Parties must furnish electronic copies in MS Word 6.0 (or later) supplemented by a separate file in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format. Parties must follow WAC 480-07-140(5) in organizing and identifying electronic files.
- 17 **ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION OF DOCUMENTS.** The presiding officer granted a one-day extension of the paper-filing requirement under WAC 480-07-145(6), allowing electronic submission of documents with the Commission on the deadlines established by the procedural schedule. Parties must submit documents through the Commission's Web Portal (www.utc.wa.gov/e-filing) or by e-mail to (records@utc.wa.gov), and file an original, plus **eighteen** (**18**) paper copies, of the documents with the Commission by the following business day. Parties must provide courtesy copies of their electronic submissions to the presiding administrative law judge and the parties to the proceeding.
- The Commission requires parties to submit documents in adjudicative proceedings no later than 2:00 p.m. on the deadline date to give Records Center personnel adequate time to post and distribute them.
- 19 **ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION**. The Commission supports the informal settlement of matters before it. Parties are encouraged to consider means of resolving disputes informally. The Commission does have limited ability to provide dispute resolution services; if you wish to explore those services, please call the Director, Administrative Law Division, at 360-664-1355.

NOTICE TO PARTIES: A party who objects to any portion of this Order must file a written objection within ten (10) calendar days after the service date of this Order, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. The service date appears on the first page of the order in the upper right-hand corner. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review.
