3. The prayer for relief set out in the Plaintiffs' Petition for Civil Enforcement is for the Court to: (1) direct the Defendant to comply with Order 02, an agency order of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission dated August 25, 2020 in Docket TV-200029, by immediately ceasing and desisting from engaging in business as a household goods carrier, common carrier, and solid waste collection company in Washington state without first obtaining the required Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission permits or certificates; (2) issue a permanent injunction to perpetually restrain the Defendant from engaging in business as a household goods carrier, including advertising, soliciting, offering, or entering into an agreement to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation, without first obtaining a household goods carrier permit from the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission as required by RCW 81.80.075; (3) impose a judgment on the Defendant for the outstanding \$62,000 civil penalty assessed in Order 02, an agency order of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission dated August 25, 2020 in Docket TV-200029, as authorized by RCW 81.04.400; (4) impose a judgment on the Defendant in the amount of a \$20,000 civil penalty for violating the cease and desist order provision of Order 02, an agency order of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission dated August 25, 2020 in Docket TV-200029, as authorized by RCW 81.80.075(5); (5) retain jurisdiction to enforce its order; and (6) grant any further or other relief the Court deems just and appropriate.

1 4. Plaintiffs are entitled to the relief sought in the Petition for Civil Enforcement.

3 III. ORDER

4 Based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, Judgment is entered as  
5 follows:

6 1. Defendant Lugg, Inc. is directed to comply with Order 02, an agency order of  
7 the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission dated August 25, 2020  
8 in Docket TV-200029, by immediately ceasing and desisting from engaging in  
9 business as a household goods carrier, common carrier, or solid waste collection  
10 company in Washington state without first obtaining from the Washington  
11 Utilities and Transportation Commission the required permits or certificates  
12 under Title 81 RCW.

13  
14 2. Defendant Lugg, Inc. is hereby enjoined and permanently restrained from  
15 directly or indirectly engaging in any of the following conduct:

16 a. Engaging in business as a household goods carrier by transporting  
17 household goods for compensation, by motor vehicle between points in  
18 Washington state, without first obtaining a household goods carrier  
19 permit from the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission.

21 b. Engaging in business as a household goods carrier by advertising,  
22 soliciting, offering, or entering into an agreement to transport household  
23 goods in Washington state, without first obtaining a household goods  
24 carrier permit from the Washington Utilities and Transportation  
25 Commission.


3. Defendant Lugg, Inc. is directed to pay the outstanding \$62,000 civil penalty assessed in Order 02, an agency order of the Utilities and Transportation Commission dated August 25, 2020 in Docket TV-200029, imposed against Lugg, Inc. for unlawfully engaging in business as a household goods carrier, common carrier, and solid waste collection company, pursuant to RCW 81.04.400.

4. Defendant Lugg, Inc. is directed to pay a civil penalty of \$20,000 for violating the cease and desist order provision in Order 02, an agency order of the Utilities and Transportation Commission dated August 25, 2020 in Docket TV-200029, as a result of Lugg Inc. unlawfully engaging in business as a household goods carrier by advertising and offering to provide household good carrier services without first obtaining from the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission a household goods carrier permit, pursuant to RCW 81.80.075(5).

5. The Court retains jurisdiction to enforce this Order.
