I. BASIS

This matter came before the Court on Plaintiffs State of Washington and the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission's motion for a default judgment against Defendant Lugg, Inc.

II. FINDINGS

The Court heard Plaintiffs' motion on this date. Plaintiffs appeared at the hearing through their attorney of record, Joe Dallas. Defendant did not appear at the hearing personally or through an attorney.

The Court considered the pleadings filed in this action including the declaration of Plaintiffs' counsel, the proof of service of the Amended Summons (60 days), and the Order of Default against the Defendant.

Based on the oral argument of Plaintiffs' counsel, the pleadings and evidence presented, the Court finds:

- This Court declared Defendant Lugg, Inc. to be in default by this Court's Order
 of Default filed jointly with the present order.
- Proof of service of Plaintiffs' Amended Summons (60 days) and Petition for Civil Enforcement of Agency Order, Monetary Penalties, Injunctive Relief, and Action to Recover Penalties ("Petition for Civil Enforcement") is on file with the Court.

The prayer for relief set out in the Plaintiffs' Petition for Civil Enforcement i
for the Court to: (1) direct the Defendant to comply with Order 02, an agency
order of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission dated Augus
25, 2020 in Docket TV-200029, by immediately ceasing and desisting from
engaging in business as a household goods carrier, common carrier, and solid
waste collection company in Washington state without first obtaining the
required Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission permits of
certificates; (2) issue a permanent injunction to perpetually restrain the
Defendant from engaging in business as a household goods carrier, including
advertising, soliciting, offering, or entering into an agreement to transport
household goods in the state of Washington for compensation, without first
obtaining a household goods carrier permit from the Washington Utilities and
Transportation Commission as required by RCW 81.80.075; (3) impose a
judgment on the Defendant for the outstanding \$62,000 civil penalty assessed in
Order 02, an agency order of the Washington Utilities and Transportation
Commission dated August 25, 2020 in Docket TV-200029, as authorized by
RCW 81.04.400; (4) impose a judgment on the Defendant in the amount of a
\$20,000 civil penalty for violating the cease and desist order provision of Order
02, an agency order of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission
dated August 25, 2020 in Docket TV-200029, as authorized by RCW
81.80.075(5); (5) retain jurisdiction to enforce its order; and (6) grant any
further or other relief the Court deems just and appropriate.

4. Plaintiffs are entitled to the relief sought in the Petition for Civil Enforcement.

III. ORDER

Based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, Judgment is entered as follows:

- Defendant Lugg, Inc. is directed to comply with Order 02, an agency order of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission dated August 25, 2020 in Docket TV-200029, by immediately ceasing and desisting from engaging in business as a household goods carrier, common carrier, or solid waste collection company in Washington state without first obtaining from the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission the required permits or certificates under Title 81 RCW.
- Defendant Lugg, Inc. is hereby enjoined and permanently restrained from directly or indirectly engaging in any of the following conduct:
 - a. Engaging in business as a household goods carrier by transporting household goods for compensation, by motor vehicle between points in Washington state, without first obtaining a household goods carrier permit from the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission.
 - b. Engaging in business as a household goods carrier by advertising, soliciting, offering, or entering into an agreement to transport household goods in Washington state, without first obtaining a household goods carrier permit from the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission.
