### **Re: Energy Efficiency**

Please identify, by year, for each year 2021 through 2025, the actual or projected total amount of low-income energy efficiency spending as a percentage of total residential energy efficiency spending through programs incorporated into the CEIP.

## Response:

Puget Sound Energy ("PSE") does not track low-income energy efficiency spending as it does not require income information to participate in its variety of programs. That said, PSE can provide Low-Income Weatherization ("LIW") program information and total residential energy efficiency spending for 2021 and projected annual spending for 2022 and 2023. The program budget for the years 2024 and 2025 will be determined in the upcoming 2024-2025 Biennial Conservation Plan. To participate in the LIW program, customers' income must be below 80% of the area median income or 200% of the federal poverty level, whichever is higher.
