Dear Ms. Washburn:

Qwest Corporation (Qwest) is forwarding for filing the sheets listed on Attachment A. Qwest respectfully requests that this filing become effective with less-than-statutory consideration on March 13, 2003.

This filing introduces N11 Service. N11 provides wire-line customers with the ability to dial a three-digit code rather than a seven or ten digit number to be connected to a pre-programmed telephone number as if that number was dialed directly. The specific N11 services being deployed include 211 Service, 311 Service, 511 Service and 711 Service. These services will not be made available to the public until they are purchased by the provider of the applicable service.

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) in CC Docket 92-105, specified how 211, 311, 511 and 711 codes would be assigned to facilitate network access to various types of information of interest to the public.

The use of each specific code is as follows:

- 211** Public, health, and community services. 211 calls will most likely be administered by the United Way, the Association of Information Referral Services or a United Way designated organization.
- 311** Non-emergency police, fire and municipal business. Local and municipal governments will administer 311 calls.
- 511** Road and traffic conditions. The state department of transportation or designated local departments of transportation will administer 511 calls in most cases.
- 711** Telecommunications Relay Service (TRS) for the speech and hearing impaired.

Support documentation for this filing is considered confidential by Qwest, is stamped as such, and should be protected under provisions of WAC 480-09-015.
