15 COMES NOW Westgate Communications LLC d/b/a “WeavTel” (the "Company") and,
16 pursuant to Chapter 480-123 of the Washington Administrative Code (“WAC”), including, but not
17 limited to, WAC 480-123-110, hereby petitions the Washington Utilities and Transportation
18 Commission (the "Commission") to receive support from the Universal Service
19 Communications Program (the "Program") for the Program year 2024.

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21 **I. Demonstration of Eligibility under WAC 480-123-100**

- 22 1. WAC 480-123-100(1)(a): The Company is a local exchange company as defined in WAC
23 480-120-021 that serves fewer than forty thousand access lines within the state.

- 1 2. WAC 480-123-100(1)(b): The Company is an incumbent local exchange carrier as defined
2 in 47 U.S.C. Sec. 251(h).
- 3 3. WAC 480-123-100(1)(c): The Company offers basic residential and business exchange
4 telecommunications services as set forth in WAC 480-120-021 and RCW 80.36.630.
- 5 4. WAC 480-123-100(1)(d): The Company has established a plan, as described in WAC 480-
6 123-110, to provide, maintain or enhance broadband service (See II.4, below).
- 7 5. WAC 480-123-100(1)(e): The Company has been designated by the Commission as an
8 eligible telecommunications carrier ("ETC") for purposes of receiving federal universal
9 services support pursuant to 47 C.F.R. Part 54 Subpart D - Universal Service Support for
10 High Cost Areas with respect to the service areas for which the Company is seeking
11 Program support.

12 13 **II. Demonstration of Eligibility under WAC 480-123-110**

- 14 1. WAC 480-123-110(1)(a): The name of the legal entity that provides communications
15 services and is seeking Program support is as follows: Westgate Communications LLC
16 d/b/a "WeavTel".
- 17 2. WAC 480-123-110(1)(b): A corporate organization chart showing the relationship between
18 the Company and affiliates as defined in RCW 80.16.010 is attached hereto as Exhibit 1. ¹
19 A detailed description of any transactions between the Company and the affiliates named in
20 Exhibit 1 recorded in the Company's operating accounts is attached hereto as Exhibit 2. ²

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23 ¹ Pursuant to agreement with Commission Staff, Exhibit 1 is limited to those affiliates having transactions with the
Company that are to be identified in Exhibit 2.

24 ² Pursuant to agreement with the Commission Staff, Exhibit 2 is limited to transactions other than employment
25 compensation and benefits pursuant to employ benefit plans. Exhibit 2 also includes transactions between the Company
and WeavNet.

- 1 3. WAC 480-123-110(1)(c): A service area map for the Company can be found at Sheet No.
2 63 of the Company's Tariff WN U-2.
- 3 4. WAC 480-123-110(1)(d): The Company's broadband plan to provide, maintain, or enhance
4 broadband services in its service area is attached hereto as Exhibit 3.
- 5 5. WAC 480-123-110(1)(f): A sworn statement by a Company officer certifying that the
6 Company complies with state and federal accounting, cost allocation, and cost adjustment
7 rules pertaining to incumbent local exchange carriers is attached as Exhibit 4.
- 8 6. WAC 480-123-110(1)(g): The number of residential local exchange access lines served by
9 the Company as of December 31, 2022, was 47. The number of residential local exchange
10 access lines served by the Company as of December 31, 2021, was 48. The number of
11 business local exchange access lines served by the Company as of December 31, 2022, was
12 45. The number of business local exchange access lines served by the Company as of
13 December 31, 2021, was 30. The number of broadband connections served by the Company
14 as of December 31, 2022, was 7. The number of broadband connections served by the
15 Company as of December 31, 2021, was 12. Presently, of the 302 locations (232 FCC
16 Alternative Connect Cost Model (A-CAM) mandated locations and 70 WUTC mandated
17 locations ("Category Tow Broadband Deployment Obligation") specified in Docket
18 UT-190437 and General Order R-598) the Company is required to serve with 25 Mbps
19 downstream/3 Mbps upstream or higher broadband service. The Company met the
20 projection of 93 of the FCC required locations and 30 of the WUTC required locations
21 WeavTel committed to in General Order R-598 and had access to 25/3 Mbps broadband
22 speeds by January 1st, 2023. The unbundled monthly recurring rate charged by the
23 Company for residential local exchange access service on December 31, 2022, was
24 \$25.00. The unbundled monthly recurring rate charged by the Company for residential
25 local exchange access service on December 31, 2021 was \$25.00.


1 The unbundled monthly rate charged by the Company for single line business local
2 exchange access service on December 31, 2022, was \$35.00. The unbundled monthly rate
3 charged by the Company for single line business local exchange access service on
4 December 31, 2021, was \$35.00. The unbundled monthly rate charged for broadband
5 service as of December 31, 2022, and as of December 31, 2021, is set out in the attached
6 Exhibit 5.

- 7 7. WAC 480-123-110(1)(h): The requested statements are attached as Exhibit 6.
- 8 8. WAC 480-123-110(1)(h)(i): A sworn statement by a Company officer certifying that the
9 Company is in compliance with the Federal Communications Commission's obligation for
10 deployment of broadband at speeds specified by the Federal Communications Commission
11 applicable to the Company and that the Company meets one of the eligibility criteria set out
12 in WAC 480-123-110(1)(j)(ii), (iii) or (iv) is attached at Exhibit 7.
- 13 9. All exhibits attached hereto are incorporated into this Petition as though fully set forth.


