# I. INTRODUCTION

("Interpretive and Policy Statement") issued by this Commission in Docket No. UT-960269, and

at the request of Dave Dittemore, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission

("Commission" or "WUTC") staff, U S WEST Communications, Inc. ("U S WEST") and

Northwest Telephone, Inc. ("Northwest") hereby submit for approval by the Commission the

Northwest and U S WEST. It is being submitted pursuant to a request from Dave Dittemore to change the terms of the agreement to comply with federal standards.

The original Agreement set forth terms, conditions and prices under which U S WEST agreed to provide services for resale and certain Unbundled Network Elements, Ancillary Functions and additional features in each LATA in which both U S WEST and Northwest operate within the state of Washington. The Agreement also had terms, conditions and prices under which the parties agreed to provide interconnection and reciprocal compensation for the exchange of local traffic for the purpose of offering telecommunications services. The Agreement stated that the pricing for these services is subject to the outcome of the Commission's determination in the Generic Pricing Docket, UT-960369, et al.

This Revised Page was prepared to bring the agreement into compliance with federal standards. All parties have been notified of the new language and have agreed to the new language. It is submitted for approval pursuant to Section 252(e) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended by the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (the "Act"), the requirements of the Commission's Interpretive and Policy Statement, and at the request of Commission staff.

## II. REASONS FOR APPROVAL

Section 252(e)(2) of the Act directs that a state commission may reject an Agreement reached through negotiation and/or arbitration only if the Commission finds that:

- 1) The Agreement (or portions thereof) discriminates against a telecommunications carrier not a party to the Agreement; or
- 2) The implementation of such Agreement or portion is not consistent with the public interest, convenience and necessity.

U S WEST and Northwest respectfully submit that the Revised Page provides no basis for either of these findings and thus request that the Commission approve the Revised Page expeditiously. First, the Revised Page does not discriminate against any other telecommunications carrier. There is no finding that the terms of this Revised Page are more favorable than terms provided to other carriers.

Second, the Revised Page is consistent with the public interest as identified in the procompetitive policies of the state of Washington, the WUTC, the U.S. Congress and the Federal Communications Commission. In addition, because this Revised Page does not discriminate against any other telecommunications carrier, state law policies prohibiting unreasonable discrimination are preserved by approval of this Revised Page.

For the foregoing reasons, U S WEST and Northwest submit that approval of this Revised Page is warranted because it satisfies the state and federal criteria for approval.

## III. UNDERSTANDING AND AGREEMENT OF PARTIES

With respect to the Revised Page, the Parties understand and agree that this Revised Page modifies Section (A)3.2: Term of the Agreement, of the original agreement, regarding the 160 day negotiation period.

- (A)3.1.5 The Parties shall work cooperatively to minimize fraud associated with third-number billed calls, calling card calls, and any other services related to this Agreement.
- (A)3.1.6 Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent either Party from seeking to recover the costs and expenses, if any, it may incur in (a) complying with and implementing its obligations under this Agreement, the Act, and the rules, regulations and orders of the FCC and the Commission, and (b) the development, modification, technical installation and maintenance of any systems or other infrastructure which it requires to comply with and to continue complying with its responsibilities and obligations under this Agreement.

# (A)3.2 Term of Agreement

This Agreement shall become effective upon Commission approval, pursuant to Sections 251 and 252 of the Act, shall terminate on, August 1, 2001 and shall be binding upon the Parties during that term. After the date specified above, this Agreement shall continue in force and effect until terminated by either Party providing written notice of termination to the other Party. The day the notice is served will determine the starting point for a 160 day negotiation period (in accordance with 252 (b) 1 of the Act). In the event of such termination, existing or pending service arrangements made available under this Agreement shall continue in total without interruption under either a) a new or adoption agreement executed by the Parties, or b) tariff terms and conditions generally available to all Co Providers and resellers.

- (A)3.2.1 If the Parties are unable to negotiate a new agreement following provision of the one hundred sixty (160) day notice of termination, the window of opportunity to file for arbitration to resolve outstanding contractual issues in accordance with the Act will occur between days 135 and 160 of the 160 day notice period.
- (A)3.2.2If the Parties are able to reach agreement, this Agreement shall continue for the brief period of time needed to secure the Commission's approval of an adoption or interconnection/resale agreement. In the case of Section (A)3.2.1, this Agreement will expire on the termination date specified in the one hundred sixty (160) day notice referenced above unless a petition for arbitration has been filed, but if such a petition has been filed then this Agreement shall continue for the brief period necessary for the Commission to act and resolve the disputed issues so that the Parties will have an effective interconnection/resale agreement.
