## TO INTERESTED PERSONS:

On May 7, 2008, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) filed with the Code Reviser a Preproposal Statement of Inquiry (CR-101) to initiate a rulemaking to consider revisions to WAC 480-70, governing solid waste collection companies.

Staff has drafted rule language for discussion purposes that could replace current WAC 480-70-016 and clarified when a solid waste certificate or motor carrier permit is needed. The draft language also defines "private carriage." Staff is interested to hear from stakeholders concerning this discussion draft rule. The discussion draft rule is available for inspection on the Commission's web site at <a href="www.utc.wa.gov/080591">www.utc.wa.gov/080591</a>. The Commission will send you a paper copy of the discussion draft rule or will send the proposal via electronic mail, if you ask.

The draft rule addresses the following topics:

- 1. When a solid waste collection certificate is required.
- 2. Private carriage of solid waste collection.
- 3. Commercial recycling collection requires a motor carrier permit.
- 4. Commercial and industrial byproducts that require solid waste certificate.
- 5. Conditions for transporting mixed recyclable materials to a sorting facility.
