- JUDGE BALLASH: Let's be on the record.
- 3 The hearing will please come to order. The Washington
- 4 Utilities and Transportation Commission has set for
- 5 hearing at this time and place docket No. 921065 which
- 6 is the complaint of SESCO, Inc. versus Pacific Power
- 7 and Light Company. Today's date is March 12, 1993.
- 8 The hearing is being held via telephone conference
- 9 call from Olympia, Washington before administrative
- 10 law judge Heather Ballash of the Office of
- 11 Administrative Hearings. The purpose of today's
- 12 hearing is to hear argument on a motion filed by SESCO
- 13 to compel answers to data requests from Pacific Power
- 14 and Light. At this time I will take appearances of
