- 1 **Penalty.** On May 13, 2011, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) assessed a penalty in Docket TE-110747 in the amount of \$100 against Excalibur Limousine LLC. (Excalibur Limousine or Company), for a violation of Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-30-071. This rule requires charter and excursion carriers to furnish annual safety reports to the Commission no later than December 31 each year. The Commission sent letters notifying and reminding the company of this requirement in November 2010 and January 2011; the November letter included the required forms.

- 2 As of April 28, 2011, Excalibur Limousine had not filed its Annual Report for 2010. In the penalty assessment, the Commission advised Excalibur Limousine that it was required to act within 15 days of receiving the notice either to pay the \$100 penalty, request a hearing to contest the alleged violation, or request mitigation to contest the amount of the penalty.

- 3 **Mitigation Request.** On May 17, 2011, Excalibur Limousine submitted a letter to the Commission admitting the violation but seeking to have the penalty waived. Mr. Kevin Williams, owner of the company, stated that he did “not recall receiving anything to fill out but would gladly do so as it would have taken no time at all.” According to Mr. Williams, Excalibur Limousine operated only a single vehicle during 2010 and that was on a part-time basis.

- 4 **Commission Staff Opposition to Mitigation.** Commission Staff filed a Response opposing the Company’s request for mitigation on June 10, 2011. According to Commission Staff, the Commission’s notification and reminder letters were sent to the same Kenmore address where Mr. Williams received the penalty assessment.

Commission Staff also notes that all the required forms are available electronically on the Commission's website. Commission Staff asked that the company's request be denied.

- 5 **Commission Decision.** The Commission denies request for mitigation. As pointed out by Commission Staff's response, all Commission correspondence regarding the annual report filing requirement was directed to the same address. Mr. Williams does not claim any problems with mail delivery but only a failure to remember receiving the Commission's letters. As a regulated transportation company, Excalibur Limousine must timely file an annual report and its owner should have been aware of this requirement when he received the certificate from the Commission.
- 6 The original \$100 penalty will not be reduced. That penalty is due and payable no later than July 15, 2011.
- 7 The Secretary has been delegated authority to enter this Order on behalf of the Commissioners under WAC 480-07-904(1)(h).

On May 16, 2011, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (commission) issued Penalty Assessment TE-110747 against Excalibur Limousine LLC (Excalibur Limousine) in the amount of \$100, for one violation of Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-30-071, which requires charter and excursion carriers to furnish annual safety reports to the commission no later than December 31 each year.

On May 23, 2011, Excalibur Limousine filed with the commission its application for mitigation of penalties (Mitigation Request). Excalibur Limousine admitted the alleged violation but asked that the penalty amount be waived.

In its Mitigation Request, Excalibur Limousine does not dispute that the violation occurred. The company states that during 2010 it operated only one vehicle, part time, and had no accidents or safety incidents of any kind. The company stated that it did not recall receiving a letter from Mr. Danner, but would fill out a form if "someone would kindly send" one.

The initial annual report letter and reminder notice were sent to the same address the Penalty Assessment was sent. Additionally, annual report forms are available on the commission's website. The company had access to the form, and was responsible for filling it out and sending it in.



The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) believes that you have committed a violation of Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-30-071, which requires charter and excursion carriers to file annual reports with the Commission by December 31 each year. You are classified as such a company. Commission records show that you did not make the filing by the required date of December 31, 2010. Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 81.04.405 allows penalties of \$100 for every such violation. Each and every such violation shall be a separate and distinct offense and, in the case of a continuing violation, every day's continuance shall be deemed to be a separate and distinct violation.

As a result, the Commission hereby notifies you that it has assessed penalties against you in the amount \$100, as follows:

On November 3, 2010, the Commission mailed 2010 Annual Report forms and 2011 Regulatory Fee packets to charter and excursion carriers registered in Washington State. A letter from Executive Secretary David W. Danner instructed companies to file annual reports and pay regulatory fees by December 30, 2010. Further, the letter stated failure to file the annual report by December 30 would result in a penalty and possible cancellation of the company's permit to operate in Washington. Those companies wishing to request an extension to file the annual report were asked to do so prior to December 30, providing a reason for the requested extension. You did not request an extension.

On January 14, 2011, the Commission sent letters to those companies that had not yet filed their reports. The letter, signed by Mr. Danner, gave an extension to companies to file their reports by January 31, 2011.

In the letter, Mr. Danner stated the Commission would not seek a fine or move to cancel the authority of any company with a report received by the Commission postmarked no later than January 31, 2011.

As of April 28, 2011, Excalibur Limousine LLC failed to file the 2010 Annual Report.

This information, if proved at a hearing and not rebutted or explained, is sufficient to support the penalty assessment.

Your penalty is due and payable now. If you believe the violation did not occur, you may request a hearing to contest the penalty assessment. If there is a reason for the violation that you think should excuse you from the penalty, you may ask for mitigation (reduction) of this penalty. See RCW 81.04.405.

You have the right to present your request for review or mitigation at a hearing, but you are not required to do so. If you do, the Commission will review the evidence supporting your request in an informal hearing, called a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding, before an administrative law judge. The administrative law judge will consider your plea and notify you of his or her decision.


