7	Good afternoon. I am Marguerite Friedlander,
8	administrative law judge with the Commission, and we're here
9	today on January 21, 2015, for a prehearing conference in Docket
LO	UG-140381, a complaint against Cascade Natural Gas Corporation
11	related to incorrect application of late payment charges, late
12	payment charge tariff conditions, and rates and charges related
13	to disconnect visits.
L 4	Let's go ahead and take appearances first, and then
15	we'll have you state your name for the record, spelling the last
16	name. Give us your mailing address, your phone number please
L7	don't bother with the fax number and your e-mail address,
18	starting with Staff.
19	MR. CASEY: Hi. My name is Christopher Casey. I'm
20	an Assistant Attorney General with the Utilities and
21	Transportation Commission.
22	MR. BROWN: Wait a minute.
23	MR. CASEY: Oh. Christopher Casey, Assistant
24	Attorney General with the Utilities and Transportation

25 Commission. Last name is spelled C-a-s-e-y.

- 4 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Great. Thank you.
- 5 MS. BROWN: Sally Brown, Senior Assistant Attorney
- 6 General, also entering an appearance on behalf of Commission
- 7 Staff in this docket. My contact information is as previously
- 8 noted.
- 9 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Excellent.
- 10 And who's going to be primary on this for purposes of
- 11 the prehearing conference order?
- MS. BROWN: Mr. Casey.
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Okay. Thank you.
- 14 Let's go ahead and take an appearance from Cascade.
- 15 MS. RACKNER: I'm Lisa Rackner, R-a-c-k-n-e-r,
- 16 counsel for Cascade Natural Gas. My mailing address is 419

- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Thank you.
- 20 And appearing today on behalf of Public Counsel?
- 21 MS. GAFKIN: My name is Lisa Gafken, G-a, "f," as in
- 22 Frank, k-e-n. I'm an Assistant Attorney General appearing on
- 23 behalf of Public Counsel.
- I'll note, though -- and I'll give the full
- 25 appearance, but I'll note that Simon ffitch will be the lead

- 1 attorney on this case, and Lea Fisher will be the lead
- 2 analyst --
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Thank you.
- 4 MS. GAFKEN: -- for Public Counsel. So I'm the

- Do the parties want the Commission's discovery rules

- 1 to be available to them? Do you anticipate discovery?
- MS. GAFKIN: Yes, we do.
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Okay. Then we'll make those
- 4 available.
- In addition, does anyone need the protective order or
- 6 highly confidential protective order that we usually use? You
- 7 can always ask for one later if one's not necessary right now.
- 8 MS. RACKNER: Yeah. At this point we don't think any
- 9 issues have been raised that would require the discovery order.
- 10 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Okay. Thank you.
- MS. BROWN: The protective order?
- MS. RACKNER: The protective order, yeah.
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Right, right.
- Okay. Thank you.
- The next thing on my list is waiver of paper service.
- 16 So we like to have the service of orders and other
- 17 paperwork that the Commission generates served electronically,
- 18 but the legislature has required that we ask you and get a
- 19 waiver for that kind of activity.
- So does anyone have a problem with waiving paper
- 21 service from the Commission?
- MS. RACKNER: No.
- MR. CASEY: No.
- 24 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Okay. Thank you. So everyone
- 25 has consented to that.

- 1 It sounded like before we came on the record that the
- 2 schedule was being hammered out.
- 3 Do we have a full schedule, or do I need to go off
- 4 the record and have a discussion?
- 5 MS. RACKNER: We do need to go off the record to
- 6 complete, yeah.
- 7 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Okay. That's fine. That's fine.
- 8 We'll be off the record. Thank you.
- 9 (A break was taken from 1:07 p.m.
- 10 to 1:28 p.m.)
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: All right. We're back on the
- 12 record.
- Would somebody like to summarize the agreement on the
- 14 procedural schedule?
- MR. CASEY: Yes, I can.
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Mr. Casey?
- MR. CASEY: So we are hoping to be able to stipulate
- 18 to facts and deal with this matter on a paper record, so our
- 19 procedural schedule matches that intent. We have today's
- 20 prehearing conference. We have settlement conferences scheduled
- 21 for February 20th and March 12th. These will be all-day
- 22 conferences here.
- 23 Summary determination motions to be filed on April
- 24 9th, and responses to summary determination motions filed on
- 25 April 29th.

- 1 And then we would like to reserve a day for oral
- 2 argument on the summary determination motions for the 15th, if
- 3 that works with your calendar, and that's May 15.
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: May 15? Okay.
- 5 So paper record except for, obviously, the oral
- 6 arguments?
- 7 MR. CASEY: Yes.
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Okay.
- 9 MR. CASEY: And we are hoping that we can stipulate
- 10 to facts prior to the summary determination motion.
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Okay.
- 12 MS. BROWN: And this is Sally Brown. It's not a full
- 13 drawn conclusion that we will, in fact, need oral argument.
- 14 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Oral arguments. Okay.
- 15 MS. BROWN: But it's just sort of in the packet in
- 16 the event some party feels strongly that we should go forward
- 17 with that.
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Okay. Sure.
- And just give me enough heads-up in case so we get
- 20 the court reporter scheduled and everything. It looks like from
- 21 my calendar May 15 would be fine, so that's good.
- MR. CASEY: Okay.
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Okay. Well, let me just check my
- 24 notes and make sure I have covered everything.
- 25 When filing documents with the Commission, parties

1	should file an original and three copies.
2	And as stated before, if we do need a protective
3	order, please let me know, and one can be provided by the
4	Commission.
5	Is there anything else that we need to address before
6	we adjourn?
7	Okay.
8	MR. CASEY: No.
9	JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Thank you. Well, we are
10	adjourned, then. Thank you.
11	MR. CASEY: Thank you.
12	MS. BROWN: Thank you.
13	MS. RACKNER: Thank you so much.
