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# **INTRODUCTION**

- On December 21, 2023, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) suspended this matter which concerns Murrey's Disposal Company's (Murrey's or Company) most recent rate case pending an investigation into whether the filed rates were fair, just, reasonable, and sufficient.
- 2 On February 5, 2024, following a pre-hearing conference, the Commission issued Order 02 setting a procedural schedule for this proceeding.<sup>1</sup>
- 3 On May 8, 2024, the Company filed a Petition for Interim Rate Relief (Petition) pursuant to Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-15-520(6). In its Petition, the Company requested that the Commission resolve the petition on an expedited basis. The Company made arguments that the present matter meets the six criteria for interim relief (PNB factors) articulated in *Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission v. Pacific Northwest Bell*, Docket No. U-72-30.
- 4 On May 29, 2024, Commission staff (Staff) filed a response to the Company's Petition. Staff argued that the Company's petition did not present sufficient evidence for five of the six relevant PNB factors. As a result, Staff recommended that the Petition be denied.
- 5 Pursuant to Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 34.05.482, WAC 480-520(6), and WAC 480-07-610, the Commission determines that a brief adjudicative proceeding is appropriate for resolving the issues presented by the Petition. Given that the issue has been briefed, and the Company has claimed that either a gross hardship or a gross

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inequity will result if the requested relief is not granted, the Commission will consider this matter on an expedited schedule.

- 6 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it will hold a virtual brief adjudicative proceeding in this matter at 1:30 p.m. on Thursday, July 18, 2024. - 7 **PURPOSE**: The purpose of the brief adjudicative proceeding is to consider the extraordinary relief requested by the Company pursuant to WAC 480-07-520(6) and clarify the factual basis for it.
- 8 The record in this proceeding will consist of any documents regarding the matter that are considered by or prepared for the presiding officer for the brief adjudicative proceeding and a transcript of any oral statements given at the hearing. The statements will be given under oath.
- 9 Parties wishing to submit any other documents for consideration at the brief adjudicative proceeding must file with the Commission all proposed exhibits, as well as a list enumerating and describing them, no later than **Thursday**, **July 11**, **2024**, **at 5 p.m.** Filing shall be in accordance with WAC 480-07-140.
- Witness lists shall also be due at the same time as the exhibits and exhibit lists. Parties should not file witness lists but must provide them by email to the presiding administrative law judge and the other parties by Thursday, July 11, 2024, at 5:00 p.m.
- 11 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the brief adjudicative proceeding set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.
