1           JUDGE MOSS: We'll be on the record. Good  
2 afternoon. My name is Dennis Moss. I'm an  
3 Administrative Law Judge with the Washington  
4 Utilities and Transportation Commission. We are  
5 convened this afternoon in the Commission's hearing  
6 room in Olympia in the -- I'm looking for the style  
7 -- matter styled Petition of San Juan Express, Inc.,  
8 Petitioner, Relating to Discontinuance of Commercial  
9 Ferry Service Authorized by Certificate of  
10 Convenience and Necessity Number BC-117. Our docket  
11 number is TS-090424.

12           We this morning had our evidentiary  
13 proceedings in this matter, and we are convened now  
14 at 1:30 in the afternoon for purposes of taking any  
15 comment that members of the public may wish to offer.  
16 It appears from the hearing room that there is no one

4                 CHAIRMAN GOLTZ:  No.  I thank you all for  
5     coming, and sorry we didn't hear more from the

8     previously marked as Exhibit B-4, and this is public

14    the day, we'll just simply add those on.  I'm sure  
15    that the parties will get copies of those, as well.

18    thanks to those of Chairman Goltz and say thank you  
19    all very much for putting on a nice hearing, and  
20    we'll take this matter under advisement and the  
21    Commissioners will render their decision in due
