Dear Mr. Rowland:

This letter is to verify that the storage methods proposed by Kleenwell Biohazard will meet the Infectious Waste Regulations as set forth in Title 10 of the Code of the King County Board of Health. On July 3, 1990, I inspected the freezer facility that your company proposed to use to store infectious waste. The freezer has the capacity to store approximately 40 boxes, which will be dated on the day of pick up. Boxes that are placed in the freezer for storage must remain in the freezer for the duration of the storage time (i.e. there shall be no rotation of boxes from freezer to regular storage facilities). The 8 day maximum storage time will commence immediately when boxes are stored at room temperature. Certificates of destruction from the final treatment site will be required, and you should keep them on file. The 2 mil bags you proposed for use will be acceptable.

If you choose to change the final treatment and/or disposal site, you must notify the Health Department in advance, and obtain approval for that site prior to use of the new site. If you have any questions or need other information, please do not hesitate to contact me at 296-4831.
