- NATURE OF PROCEEDINGS. On May 8, 2009, Puget Sound Energy, Inc. (PSE), filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) certain tariff revisions designed to effect a general rate increase in its rates for electric service (Docket UE-090704) and gas service (Docket UG-090705) to customers in Washington. The proposed revisions provide for a general rate increase of 7.4 percent for the electric tariffs and 2.2 percent for the gas tariffs. The Commission suspended operation of the tariffs by Order 01 entered in these dockets following the May 28, 2009, open meeting. The Commission consolidated these dockets by Order 02, entered on June 8, 2009.
- 2 **CONFERENCE/PRESIDING OFFICERS.** The Commission convened a prehearing conference in this proceeding at Olympia, Washington on June 22, 2009, before Administrative Law Judge Dennis J. Moss, whom the Commission appoints as presiding officer in this proceeding.
- PARTY REPRESENTATIVES. Sheree Strom Carson, Perkins Coie, Bellevue, Washington, represent PSE. Simon ffitch, Assistant Attorney General, Seattle, Washington, represents the Public Counsel Section of the Washington Office of Attorney General (Public Counsel). Robert D. Cedarbaum, Senior Assistant Attorney

General and Michael Fassio, Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, represent the Commission's regulatory staff (Commission Staff or Staff).<sup>1</sup>

- S. Bradley Van Cleve and Irion Sanger, Davison Van Cleve, Portland, Oregon, represent the Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities (ICNU). Chad M. Stokes, Cable Huston Benedict Haagensen & Lloyd LLP, Portland, Oregon, represents Northwest Industrial Gas Users (NWIGU). Elaine L. Spencer, Graham & Dunn PC, Seattle, Washington, represents Seattle Steam Company (Seattle Steam). Michael L. Kurtz and Kurt J. Boehm, Boehm, Kurtz & Lowry, Cincinnati, Ohio, represent the Kroger Co., on behalf of its Fred Meyer Stores and Quality Food Centers divisions (Kroger). Norman Furuta, Associate Counsel, Department of the Navy, San Francisco, California, represents the Federal Executive Agencies (FEA). Ronald L. Roseman, Attorney, Seattle, Washington, represents the Energy Project. John A. Cameron, Davis Wright Tremaine LLP, represents Cost Management Services, Inc. David S. Johnson, attorney, Northwest Energy Coalition (NWEC) represents his organization.

There is an "*ex parte* wall" separating the Commissioners, the presiding ALJ, and the Commissioners' policy and accounting advisors from all parties, including Staff. *RCW* 

- These petitioners each demonstrated their substantial interest in this proceeding and that their participation will be in the public interest. There were no objections to the petitions to intervene. The petitions to intervene by ICNU, NWIGU, NWEC, Seattle Steam Company, Kroger Company, the Federal Executive Agencies and Cost Management Services, Inc., and the Energy Project's oral motion, are granted.
- **PROTECTIVE ORDER.** The Commission entered Order 03, a protective order in this docket under RCW 34.05.446, RCW 80.04.095, WAC 480-07-420 and WAC 480-07-423, on June 23, 2009, to facilitate discovery.
- DISCOVERY. Discovery will continue pursuant to the Commission's discovery rules, WAC 480-07-400 425. The parties request a shortened response period for data request after Staff, Public Counsel and the intervenors file their response testimony. The response time for data requests will be reduced to five business days, after November 17, 2009. In addition, to expedite the exchange of potentially relevant information, all parties are required to provide all work papers, including model runs and source documents, at the time they prefile testimony and exhibits. The Commission urges the parties to work cooperatively together to avoid having to bring discovery matters forward for formal resolution.
- 9 **PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE.** The parties agreed on a procedural schedule. The Commission adopts this procedural schedule as set forth below and in Appendix B to this Order.

Public Counsel is required to submit a status report concerning its efforts to reach consensus with Staff and PSE on the content and format of any public notice PSE is required to issue in connection with this proceeding. The status report must be filed no later than July 23, 2009.

- NOTICE OF HEARING. The Commission will hold evidentiary hearings in this matter beginning January 19, 2010, at 9:30 a.m., in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.
- PUBLIC COMMENT HEARINGS. The Commission will provide three opportunities for members of the public to comment orally during public comment hearings. These hearings will be in Bremerton, Kirkland and Olympia. The dates and locations will be determined and noticed for hearing in due course.
- DOCUMENT PREPARATION AND FILING REQUIREMENTS. Parties must file the original plus 16 copies of the unredacted versions of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials. Parties must also file the original and 1 copy of any redacted version(s). These materials must conform to the format and publication guidelines in WAC 480-07-395 and WAC 480-07-460. The Commission prefers that materials be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.

- All filings must be mailed or delivered to the Executive Director and Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by the U.S. Postal Service.
- An electronic copy of all filings must be provided through the Commission's Web Portal (www.utc.wa.gov/e-filing) or by e-mail delivery to <<u>records@utc.wa.gov</u>>. Alternatively, parties may furnish an electronic copy by delivering with each filing a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette or CD including the filed document(s). Parties must furnish electronic copies in MS Word 6.0 (or later) supplemented by a separate file in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format. Parties must follow WAC 480-07-140(5) in organizing and identifying electronic files.
- a one-day extension of the paper-filing requirement under WAC 480-07-145(6), allowing electronic submission of documents with the Commission on the filing deadline. Parties must submit documents through the Commission's Web Portal (www.utc.wa.gov/e-filing) or by e-mail to <a href="mailto:records@utc.wa.gov">records@utc.wa.gov</a>, and file an original, plus 16 paper copies, of the documents with the Commission by the following business day. Parties must provide courtesy copies of their electronic submissions to the presiding administrative law judges and the parties to the proceeding.
