- 1 On October 1, 2008, Olympic Pipe Line Company (Olympic), filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) in Docket TO-031973 a Petition for Approval of Amendment No. 7 to Tariff Settlement Agreement of 2003.
- 2 Olympic also filed on October 1, 2008, a Motion to Reopen Docket TO-031973 to Allow Filing of Petition for Approval of Amendment No. 7 to Tariff Settlement Agreement, and a Motion for Protective Order. On October 6, 2008, the Commission entered in Docket TO-031973, a standard protective order.
- 3 On September 30, 2008, Olympic filed with the Commission in Docket TO-081785 a Petition for Approval of Transfer of Property of a Storage Lease Agreement with BP West Coast Products, LLC.

4 As the matters in Dockets TO-031973 and TO-081785 appear to involve related facts and principles of law, it is appropriate that they be consolidated for hearing and determination pursuant to WAC 480-07-320.

5 **STATUTORY AUTHORITY:** The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under RCW Title 81, and has legal authority to regulate the rates, services, and practices of petroleum pipeline companies. The statutes that apply to this matter include RCW 81.01, RCW 81.04, RCW 81.12, RCW 81.16, RCW 81.20, RCW 81.28, RCW 81.44, and RCW 81.88 relating to rates, including but not limited to RCW 80.01.040 and RCW 81.04.020. The rules that apply to this matter include those within WAC 480-07 and WAC 480-75.

6 The Commission will hear this matter under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), particularly Part IV of RCW 34.05 relating to adjudications. The provisions of the APA that relate to this proceeding include, but are not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452.

7 **THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That the Commission will hold a prehearing conference in this matter at 10:00 a.m., on Monday, November 10, 2008, in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.** If you are unable to attend the prehearing conference in person, you may attend via the Commission's teleconference bridge line, **360-664-3846**. Please appear on the teleconference bridge five minutes before the conference is scheduled to begin.

8 The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for intervention, resolve scheduling matters, to identify the issues in the proceeding and determine other matters to assist the Commission in resolving the matter, as listed in WAC 480-07-430.

9 **INTERVENTION:** Persons who wish to intervene should file a petition to intervene in writing at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference. *See WAC 480-07-355(a)*. The Commission will consider oral petitions to intervene during the conference, but strongly prefers written petitions to intervene. Party representatives must file a notice of appearance with the Commission no later than the business day before the conference. *See WAC 480-07-345(2)*. Any party or witness in need of an interpreter or other assistance should fill out the form attached to this

notice and return it to the Commission. The Commission will set the time and place for any evidentiary hearings at the prehearing conference, on the record of a later conference or hearing session, or by later written notice.

10 **THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.**
