The NW Energy Coalition (“Coalition”) respectfully submits the following supplement to its April 23 statement of issues in the above-referenced docket. The matrix provided here identifies and describes several mechanisms intended to remove utility disincentives to reduce annual sales, and separately identifies and describes several mechanisms intended to align utility net income with energy efficiency performance. Some of the mechanisms listed may be more advantageous than others at removing disincentives to reduce annual sales or providing incentives for energy efficiency performance. For example, not every disincentive-removal mechanism described here accounts for all unrecovered fixed costs due to conservation. Also included in this matrix are examples of states and/or specific utilities that have utilized each mechanism.
