JUDGE CHARTOFF: We are on the record. Today is Thursday, January 3rd, 2019, the time is 1:05 p.m., and the docket is TE-180401, which is captioned In the Matter of Determining the Proper Carrier Classification of, and Complaint For Personalities Against: Seattle 7 Days Limo. My name is Laura Chartoff, I am the administrative law judge presiding over today's brief adjudicative proceeding.

Let's start by taking short appearances of the parties starting with Staff.

MR. DALLAS: Good morning, Judge Chartoff. I am Joe Dallas, I am an assistant attorney general with the Utilities and Transportation Commission, and I'm here representing Commission Staff.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you. Okay. And can you please state your name?

MR. SINGH: Jagdip Singh.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: What is your relationship to the company?

MR. SINGH: I am the owner of the

1 company.
 2 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
 3 Okay. I will do a short introduction about
 4 why we are here. This is a special proceeding under
 5 RCW 81.04.510 to determine whether Seattle 7 Days Limo
 6 is conducting business as a passenger charter party or
 7 excursion carrier without the required permit. If we
 8 find that Seattle 7 Days Limo is engaging in such
 9 conduct, the Commission will issue an order requiring
 10 the company to cease and desist from engaging in
 11 business as a charter party and excursion carrier
 12 unless or until the company obtains the required
 13 permit from the Commission.
 14 And we also have a complaint for penalties.
 15 Any person who engages in business as a charter party
 16 or excursion service carrier in the state of
 17 Washington after its certificate has been cancelled is
 18 subject to a penalty of up to \$5,000 per violation,
 19 and here Staff has requested penalties of up to 5,000
 20 per violation and indicated it will present evidence
 21 at the hearing to address the factors for determining
 22 the appropriate penalty amount.
 23 So as far as the order today, Staff will
 24 present its case first, and then you will present your
 25 case second.

1 MR. SINGH: Sure.
 2 JUDGE CHARTOFF: When I call on each
 3 party to testify, I will swear you in with the oath of
 4 witness so that anything you tell the Court will be
 5 under oath and can be considered sworn testimony. For
 6 the court reporter's benefit, please speak slowly and
 7 clearly, and also please be sure to use the microphone
 8 on the table in front of you.
 9 Mr. Dallas, you can proceed when you are
 10 ready.
 11 MR. DALLAS: Thank you, Judge Chartoff.
 12 Staff alleges that Seattle 7 Days Limo has
 13 committed two violations of RCW 81.70.260. In part,
 14 this statute states that after the cancellation or
 15 revocation of the certificate, it is unlawful for a
 16 charter party carrier to conduct any operations as
 17 such a carrier. Any person who conducts operations as
 18 a charter party in violation of the statute is subject
 19 to a penalty of up to \$5,000 per violation; therefore,
 20 it is unlawful to conduct any operations as a charter
 21 party carrier after cancellation or revocation of a
 22 certificate.
 23 Under RCW 81.70.260, the term "conduct any
 24 operations" includes advertising or offering to
 25 provide charter party carrier services and further

Page 46

1 states that each advertisement and/or offer
 2 constitutes a separate violation. A charter party
 3 carrier is defined in RCW 81.70.020.
 4 It is important to note that the definition of
 5 a charter party carrier does not include limousine
 6 carriers, which are defined in RCW 46.04.276. A
 7 limousine carrier means any person engaged in the
 8 transportation of a person or groups of persons who,
 9 under a single contract, acquires on a prearranged
 10 basis the use of a limousine to travel to a specified
 11 destination or for a particular itinerary; therefore,
 12 one of the elements necessary to operate as a
 13 limousine carrier is that you must be operating a
 14 limousine.
 15 A limousine is defined in RCW 46.04.272 and
 16 Washington Administrative Code 308-83-010. Relevant
 17 to this matter there are six different categories of
 18 limousines, all of which hold no more than 14
 19 passengers. Staff intends to present sufficient
 20 evidence that will show Seattle 7 Days Limo, one,
 21 conducted operations; two, as a charter party carrier;
 22 three, after cancellation or revocation of its
 23 certificate; and, four, that the company was not
 24 operating as a limousine carrier.
 25 Staff will present its evidence through

 23 Q And how long have you been in that position?
 24 A A little over four years.
 25 Q And what does that position involve?

1 A It entails conducting investigations into the
2 business practices of both permitted and nonpermitted
3 companies.

4 Q Thank you.

5 Are you familiar with the matter involving
6 Seattle 7 Days Limo?

7 A Yes, I am.

8 Q And how are you involved?

9 A I am the investigator assigned to the matter.

10 Q And I am showing you a document that has been
11 identified as Exhibit JH-1.

12 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Judge, I have two
13 copies of my proposed exhibit on the bench if you
14 would like to follow along. The first tab is proposed
15 Exhibit JH-1 and the second tab is proposed Exhibit
16 JH-2.

17 I also have a copy for Mr. Singh, if you would
18 like a copy.

19 MR. SINGH: Yeah. Which one is it?
20 What page?

21 MR. DALLAS: This is my proposed
22 exhibit.

23 May I approach Mr. Singh?

24 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Yes.

25 MR. SINGH: Thank you.

1 BY MR. DALLAS:

2 Q I would like to ask you some questions of
3 Exhibit JH-1. With regard to Seattle 7 Days' website,
4 how did Staff initially become involved in this
5 matter?

6 A On April 30th of 2018, I located the website
7 for Seattle 7 Days Limo. On the website it advertised
8 a Hummer H2 that seated 16 to 22 passengers, a stretch
9 Hummer that seated 25 to 30 passengers, as well as a
10 party bus that seated 14 to 22 passengers, and the
11 website also contained prices for those various
12 vehicles.

13 Q Could you please reference Attachments A and B
14 in Exhibit JH-1.

15 A (Complies.)

16 Q Are these the advertisements you observed on
17 April 30th, 2018?

18 A Yes.

19 Q Could you please turn to what has been marked
20 as Exhibit JH-2?

21 A (Complies.)

22 Q What is this document?

23 A This is an application for charter and
24 excursion services in the state of Washington.

25 Q Did Seattle 7 Days fill out this information

1 BY MR. DALLAS:

2 Q Mr. Hoxit, what is Exhibit JH-1?

3 A This is a declaration pertaining to Seattle 7
4 Days Limo.

5 Q And are you familiar with this exhibit?

6 A Yes, I am.

7 Q And how are you familiar?

8 A I am the author of the declaration.

9 Q And in your declaration, how many attachments
10 are within it?

11 A There are Attachments A through F.

12 Q And do you agree with the information
13 contained in this exhibit?

14 A Yes, I do.

15 Q Do you have any changes that you would like to
16 make to this exhibit?

17 A No, I do not.

18 MR. DALLAS: At this time I would offer
19 to enter proposed Exhibit JH-1 into evidence.

20 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Mr. Singh, do you have
21 any objection?

22 MR. SINGH: No.

23 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Exhibit JH-1 is
24 admitted.

25 (Exhibit No. JH-1 admitted.)

1 contained in this application?

2 A Yes, they did.

3 Q Do you believe the information contained
4 within this application is authentic and what Seattle
5 7 Days originally submitted to the Commission?

6 A Yes.

7 Q Do you have any changes you would like to make
8 to Exhibit JH-2?

9 A No.

10 MR. DALLAS: At this time I would offer
11 to propose Exhibit JH-2 into evidence.

12 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Have you seen JH-2?

13 MR. SINGH: Yeah, I have.

14 Let me check. Yes.

16 objections?

17 MR. SINGH: No.

24 A (Complies.)

25 Q What did Seattle 7 Days put as their website

 2 A The website listed on the application is
 3 www.seattle7dayslimo.com.
 4 **Q And is this the same website where you viewed**
 5 **the advertisement on April 30th, 2018?**
 6 A Yes, it is.
 7 **Q Could you also read the phone number the**
 8 **company provided in its application?**
 9 A Yes. The phone number listed is
 10 (425) 361-9283.
 11 **Q Is this the same phone number as the one you**
 12 **observed on the website advertisement you observed on**
 13 **April 30th, 2018?**
 14 A Yes, it is.
 15 **Q Moving on.**
 16 **After viewing this advertisement, did you**
 17 **determine whether the company had the proper operating**
 18 **authority?**
 19 A Yes, I did.
 20 **Q And did the company have the proper operating**
 21 **authority?**
 22 A No, they did not.
 23 **Q Therefore, on April 30th, 2018, at the time**
 24 **you viewed the advertisement on Seattle 7 Days Limo's**
 25 **website, did the company have an active certificate to**

1 operate as a charter party carrier?
 2 A No.
 3 **Q And could you please turn to Attachment C of**
 4 **Exhibit JH-1?**
 5 A (Complies.)
 6 **Q Does this attachment show that the company's**
 7 **certificate was inactive within Commission records at**

 9 A Yes.
 10 **Q Could you please turn to Attachment D of**
 11 **Exhibit JH-1?**
 12 A (Complies.)
 13 **Q Could you explain what this attachment is?**
 14 A Yes. This is a letter issued to Seattle
 15 7 Days Limo from the Commission informing them that
 16 their certificate has been cancelled due to
 17 insufficient proof of insurance.
 18 **Q Did you also look to see if the company had**
 19 **any other operating authority?**
 20 A Yes.
 21 **Q And what operating authority did it have?**
 22 A The company held a limousine endorsement
 23 through the Department of Licensing.
 24 **Q Do you believe Seattle 7 Days Limo was**
 25 **properly operating as a limousine carrier, having this**

1 advertisement on the website?
 2 A No.
 3 **Q And why not?**
 4 A The limousine endorsement through the
 5 Department of Licensing allows the company to
 6 transport up to 14 passengers, whereas the vehicle
 7 capacity advertised in the website exceeded that, on
 8 both their Hummer H2, or stretch Hummer H2, as well as
 9 their party bus.
 10 **Q Thank you.**
 11 **Please explain what investigative action Staff**
 12 **took in this matter on May 9, 2018.**
 13 A On May 9th, I posed as a potential customer
 14 and contacted the company. I requested a party bus
 15 service for 22 to 29 people for a bachelor party, and
 16 the company offered me either a Hummer or a party bus
 17 for eight hours, and provided rates as well: \$1,920
 18 for the Hummer and \$1,560 for the -- sorry, I got that
 19 backwards. \$1,920 for the party bus and \$1,560 for
 20 the Hummer.
 21 **Q Does Attachment F of Exhibit JH-1 accurately**
 22 **describe the phone call conversation you had on May 9,**
 23 **2018?**
 24 A Yes, it does.
 25 **Q And what phone number did you call on May 9,**

1 2018?
 2 A (425) 361-9283.
 3 **Q And was this the same phone number as the one**
 4 **you viewed on the advertisement and the phone number**
 5 **submitted to the Commission by Seattle 7 Days Limo in**
 6 **their application?**
 7 A Yes, it was.
 8 **Q When you called this phone number, who**
 9 **answered the phone?**
 10 A I do not know the person that answered the
 11 phone.
 12 **Q After calling this individual, have you spoken**
 13 **to this person again?**
 14 A Yes, I have.
 15 **Q And the person you spoke to subsequently, was**
 16 **this the same person who answered the phone call on**
 17 **May 9, 2018?**
 18 A Yes.
 19 **Q Was Seattle 7 Days Limo properly operating as**
 20 **a limousine carrier by making you the offer on May 9,**
 21 **2018?**
 22 A No.
 23 **Q And why not?**
 24 A Again, a limousine endorsement allows up to
 25 14, and they offered 20 to 30 passengers, to transport

20 to 30 passengers.

Q What does a company need in order to conduct operations as a charter party carrier?

A You need a charter and excursion certificate through the Commission.

Q Did Seattle 7 Days Limo have a certificate from the Commission authorizing it to operate as a charter party carrier at the time it offered you transportation services or when you observed the advertisement on their website?

A No.

Q Does Staff have a recommendation as to classification of Seattle 7 Days Limo?

A Yes.

Q And what is that?

A Staff recommends that the company be classified as a charter and excursion carrier in the state of Washington.

Q Do Staff have a recommendation as to penalty?

A Yes.

Q And what is that?

A Staff recommends a penalty of \$5,000 per violation, so for a total of two violations, \$10,000.

MR. DALLAS: Thank you. No further questions.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Do you have any other witnesses?

MR. SINGH: No.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay.

MR. SINGH: No witnesses.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: So before you get started, let me swear you in.

JAGDIP SINGH, witness herein, having been first duly sworn on oath, was examined and testified as follows:

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.

MR. SINGH: Thank you.

I want to say about the website, though. So I started to build this website with a third party, which is -- I hired somebody to create my website, do my domain, because I'm not a tech guy, you know. And then they were talking about it. You know, I was not a party at that time. So when I applied for the UTC, I did have the proof for the insurance. I think they do have, too.

You guys want to make a look -- take a look out of this?

And I operated for -- for a little bit, the

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Mr. Singh, do you have any questions for Mr. Hoxit?

MR. SINGH: No.

I've got something to say, and I've got some paperwork that, actually, I can show you guys --

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Oh, okay.

MR. SINGH: -- on the website.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay.

MR. SINGH: I don't have no -- no questions so far with him.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So you will get to make your case when Staff is finished.

MR. SINGH: Exactly.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Does Staff have anything further?

MR. DALLAS: I would like to do a closing after, or would you prefer I do my closing now?

JUDGE CHARTOFF: No, you can wait until the end.

MR. DALLAS: Okay. Thank you.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So it's your turn to present your case. Before you get started, I wanted to ask -- I assume you will be testifying?

MR. SINGH: Yes.

UTC, that time. It actually has a -- they have a time period on that, three to four months. I couldn't afford it, so I shut it down, the operation, so -- which is -- the people who, actually, I bought it from, you know, they have the -- they have the -- all the -- the real owner of the domain. So the domain only works, whoever creates your website. So I don't have no control over the website, which is the owners right here.

You guys might want to take a look at the domain.

And then the domain doesn't really -- the GoDaddy don't give you no passwords until you're the owner, so they want to make sure you're the owner.

And here's what -- I actually emailed a few times the company that I actually hired to do it, which is -- which is -- will explain, you know, why I can't get -- you know, when the operation was done, when I cancelled the license and all that, how could I -- I never get the website to remove. So that will explain to you pretty much right here.

If you guys want to take a look out of this too.

And with the website, they actually provide -- you know, there is so many mistakes up here, though.

1 If I've been running it for so long, I should have
 2 just organized it so much, because it says -- first
 3 said Chrysler 300. That's actually a picture of a BMW
 4 on it. If I'm operating or if I'm trying to advertise
 5 something, I should be doing it pretty accurate so
 6 that people actually don't miss -- I don't mislead
 7 anybody.
 8 So once it got shut down the -- everything. I
 9 called them to make the changes, but they never did.

2 district owner, you know, to -- well, we'll get all
3 the information to you, so...

4 JUDGE CHARTOFF: I am going to turn this
5 over for cross.

6 MR. DALLAS: Staff has no questions.

7 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Staff has no questions.

11 By JUDGE CHARTOFF:

12 **Q So Mr. Hoxit testified that he had a**
13 **conversation with the company at the phone number --**

14 A Yes.

15 **Q -- of the company. Are you -- what is your**
16 **response to that?**

17 A So, ma'am, the response to this is, this is a
18 small industry and we work all together, all the
19 different companies, who got the UTCs [sic] and who
20 don't. And then it don't matter if they have more
21 people. And then, you know, the party bus, I don't
22 have the party busses at all. And then there's other
23 business out there. We'll charge the customer, we
24 send them out the confirmation, and when they -- when
25 they operate, those are the one -- actually operate

1 the phones.

2 **Q So this is your company?**

3 A That's my company, yes.

4 The phones are connected, so if somebody -- a
5 person don't answer it goes to the different -- the
6 second one, the third one. This is how it works.

7 **Q So there's another company that --**

8 A A few other companies, yeah, I work with.

9 **Q What is the name that --**

10 A There are A&A Limos, there are Blessed Limo.
11 There are a few others that work together.

12 **Q What are the two cars that you operate?**

13 A What are -- the car I'm operating? It's a
14 limousine carrier. It's the Hummer and the Chrysler
15 300, but I don't do anymore, I shut down the whole
16 operation.

17 This is a cancellation that I actually did for
18 my -- when I had it, though, you know, two limousines.
19 But this is a cancellation I did with my insurance.
20 Also, it says that actually I don't operate my license
21 all day. You know, limousine carriers, everything is
22 put on hold, just because I cancelled everything. I
23 don't operate it no more.

24 Or if you want to take a look you can take a
25 look.

1 the -- all the -- you know, the vehicles and stuff
2 because we're not authorized to do it.

3 Does it make sense, or no?

4 **Q No.**

5 A So I'm a limousine company, and there's a few
6 other companies who work together, and they've got a
7 UTC, and they all certified, and we work together. So
8 if I get a call, you know, we'll take the commission
9 out, and whatever, it's 20 percent. We'll just take
10 the rest -- rest to the -- to the company who actually
11 is going to work for it.

12 **Q So at the time that -- let me back up. So**
13 **that phone call, do you know who he was talking to?**

14 A No clue, ma'am. There are so many people that
15 actually go back and forth who are on the phone.
16 There are different employees every time. It's not
17 only the one guy that actually answers the phone. It
18 just -- it just gets in a circle every time, somebody
19 else working. If there is, then it just rotates,
20 pretty much.

21 I'm not quite sure who did they talk to,
22 unless they have the name, then I can tell.

23 **Q Who owns that phone number?**

24 A It's a company number, ma'am, so whoever
25 working that time, that period of time, they answered

1 **Q No, thanks.**

2 A Yeah.

3 **Q You are just saying that you closed your**
4 **limousine business?**

5 A Yes.

6 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. I don't have any
7 further questions.

8 Do you have anything further?

9 MR. DALLAS: Just a closing statement.

10 JUDGE CHARTOFF: So I will allow him to
11 make a closing statement, and then you can make a
12 closing statement if you choose.

13 MR. SINGH: Sure. What is -- a closing
14 statement is? Sorry.

15 JUDGE CHARTOFF: A closing statement is
16 where you just explain the evidence you laid out --

17 MR. SINGH: Oh, okay.

18 JUDGE CHARTOFF: -- and how you think I
19 should rule.

20 MR. SINGH: Oh, okay. All right.

21 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay.

22 MR. SINGH: Thank you.

23 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Go ahead.

24 MR. DALLAS: Thank you, Judge.

25 Staff has submitted sufficient evidence into

1 the record to establish two separate violations of
2 RCW 81.70.260, and that the company was not operating
3 as a limousine carrier.

4 In summary, you have heard from Staff that
5 Seattle 7 Days Limo advertised transportation services
6 for multiple vehicles that had a seating capacity of
7 over 14 people. This advertisement was on the website
8 that the company put in its application to become a
9 charter party carrier as its official business
10 website. Although Mr. Singh claims that he lost
11 control of the website, Staff's position is still the
12 same; however, this is something you may want to
13 consider in rendering your order.

14 The 2016 order stated that Mr. Singh had to
15 stop all operations. He failed to cease all
16 operations by continuing to make advertisements and
17 offers. And just to remind you, the term conducting
18 operations includes advertising and making offers.

19 You have also heard that the company offered
20 to provide transportation services to a group of 22 to
21 29 people for a bachelor party in Seattle for vehicles
22 that have a seating capacity of over 14 people.
23 Mr. Hoxit called the phone number that the company
24 submitted to the Commission in its application to
25 become a charter party carrier, as its official

1 actually do two limousines. They never asked or never
2 determined anything, like, oh, we wanted one vehicle
3 or we wanted two. It really depends on us how we're
4 going to accommodate the party.

5 And then the thing about the website, I've
6 already, you know, proven to you guys that I -- you
7 know, I tried to get into contact to close that down,
8 but they never did. And then there's a reason too,
9 actually. They stated that I -- you know, that we're
10 not -- so after that I had turned everything, all the
11 business I'm getting from other people. I'm not even
12 operating my own business, my own website and stuff.

13 I'm just going to get charged, you know, get a
14 penalty for it, which I don't -- have no control over
15 the website and the advertisement. You know, there is
16 a different kind of advertisement, doing a website or
17 doing a Google Adwords. I mean, if they find me doing
18 a Google Adwords, you know, that's a different story,
19 then you can tell me, like, hey, that's your fault,
20 you know, you did it. But when the website -- I mean,
21 I'm not a tech guy, I don't know how these things
22 work, domains or websites. You know, I'm explaining
23 the way I just got explained.

24 And then with the capacity, I mean, there --
25 like I said, you know, we work all -- three or four

1 business phone number, and this was the phone number
2 that was also on the advertisement.

3 Both the advertisement and the offer are two
4 separate violations of RCW 81.70.260 because the
5 company did not have a certificate to conduct
6 operations as a charter party carrier at the time the
7 advertisement was observed and the offer was made.
8 This is because the company's certificate was
9 previously revoked on December 23rd, 2016, due to
10 insufficient proof of insurance.

11 Accordingly, Staff recommends the Commission
12 issue an order for penalties of \$5,000 per violation.

13 Thank you.

14 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.

15 Okay. If you --

16 MR. SINGH: All right. Ma'am, I've got
17 something to say now.

18 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay.

19 MR. SINGH: When they say they -- they
20 called in for 30 people, or 28 people, you know, the
21 Hummer, it -- it really depends on us how we're going
22 to provide it. It didn't indicate there's going to be
23 only one vehicle they were going to provide. So he --
24 if -- if we are the limousine services, each carries a
25 14-passenger, right? The 14-passenger, then we can

1 companies together. So, if anything, you know,
2 they -- they are the one who actually provide the
3 services, but as far as that...

4 These are the only things I have to say. If I
5 have anything else I will just let you know too.

6 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Thank you.

7 MR. SINGH: Thank you.

8 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Is there anything else?

9 MR. DALLAS: Can I have a rebuttal?

10 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Sure.

11 MR. DALLAS: Judge Chartoff, I would

12 like to just point in the record, in Exhibit JH-2, the
13 vehicles they submitted in their application of any
14 charter carrier includes a Hummer that can seat 22,
15 and another Hummer that can seat 30. And I would also
16 like to point you to Attachment F of JH-1, where
17 Mr. Hoxit specifically states that he was offered a
18 stretch Hummer that seats 28 to 30, a party bus that
19 seats 28 to 30 as well.

20 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay.

21 MR. DALLAS: And that's all. Thank you.

22 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay.

23 Thank you for participating. I will issue a
24 decision within ten days.

25 MR. SINGH: Within ten days. Okay.

1 JUDGE CHARTOFF: We are off the record.
2 (Proceedings concluded 1:42 p.m.)
