Dear Mr. Rowland:

We have received and reviewed Kleenwell's application to use Recomp Incineration Facility as the final treatment/disposal site for the infectious waste collected from your clients.

We have conferred with the Whatcom County Health District and the Northwest Air Pollution Authority regarding the site. Based upon information provided by those agencies, we approve the use of that site as a final treatment/disposal site for infectious waste.

This approval is based upon the following stipulations, according to our conversation of September 20, 1990:

1. The SES sites in Southern California will be backup facilities for the treatment and disposal of waste in the event that Recomp can no longer accept the waste, or is temporarily unable to accept the waste.
2. The packaging designated in the permit application will remain the same.
3. If a change in final treatment/disposal site is sought, Kleenwell must submit (in writing) a request for approval to the Health Department. Any change in the final treatment/disposal site must be approved by the Health Department in writing prior to the use of that site.
4. The Health Department can request, at any time, to review the receipts of certificates of disposal from the facility. Kleenwell should keep the receipts on file for a minimum of three years.
