     Docket 181053 regarding a general rate case filed by
     Northwest Natural Gas.

                 My name is Nelli Doroshkin, co-presiding is

     Rayne Pearson. We are administrative law judges with

     the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission,
     and we'll be presiding in this matter along with the

     Commissioners.

                 In this prehearing conference, we'll address
16
     petitions to intervene, discovery, service list, filing
17
     and service requirements, and the procedural schedule in
     this case. After this hearing, we'll issue an order on

     these topics.

                 So to begin, we'll take appearances and then
     address petitions for intervention.

                 We will begin with Northwest Natural.

                 MS. RACKNER: Yes, I'm Lisa -- Lisa Rackner

     for Northwest Natural. I'm also here with Eric Nelsen,

     who is inside counsel for Northwest Natural.
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- JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Staff?
- 2 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Jennifer
- 3 Cameron-Rulkowski, Assistant Attorney General, appearing
- 4 on behalf of Staff. And my full appearance is on file.
- 5 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Public Counsel?
- 6 MS. SUETAKE: Nina Suetake on behalf of
- 7 Public Counsel.
- 8 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: The Alliance of Western
- 9 Energy Consumers or AWEC?
- 10 MR. BROOKS: This is Tommy Brooks from Cable
- 11 Huston on behalf of AWEC.
- 12 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: And then The Energy
- 13 Project?
- 14 MR. FFITCH: Good afternoon, Your Honors.
- 15 Simon ffitch, Attorney, appearing on behalf of The
- 16 Energy Project. And my information is contained in the
- 17 notice of appearance and petition to intervene.
- JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. So that brings us
- 19 to the petitions for intervention unless there are any
- 20 other parties, but I don't believe there are.
- 21 So are there any petitions for intervention
- 22 other than the ones that have been filed in writing?
- 23 Hearing none, we will proceed.
- We have reviewed the petitions to intervene
- of AWEC and The Energy Project. There were no written

- 1 objections filed to these petitions. Are there any
- 2 objections that anyone would like to present here?
- 3 Hearing no objections, the petitions to intervene are
- 4 granted.
- 5 Regarding a protective order, one has been
- 6 issued in this docket.
- 7 Regarding discovery, WAC 480-07-05 -- 405,
- 8 Section 2, requires parties to serve all data requests
- 9 upon all parties in this case -- or in a case. Does any
- 10 party object to the Commission making the exchange of
- 11 data request responses a requirement for parties in
- 12 discovery in this case? Okay. Hearing none, we'll
- incorporate that requirement into the prehearing
- 14 conference order.
- Regarding designated persons for service, if
- 16 any party has not yet designated a lead representative
- 17 for service, please do so via an email to me and Judge
- 18 Pearson as soon as possible, preferably by the end of
- 19 the day today. So our email addresses are
- 20 nelli.doroshkin@utc.wa.gov, and Judge Pearson's is
- 21 rayne.pearson@utc.wa.gov.
- 22 And then we also have support staff who may
- 23 be added to the service list. So if you would like to
- 24 add names and email addresses of any other
- 25 representatives or support staff who should receive

- 1 electronic courtesy copies of all the documents filed in
- 2 this proceeding, please email that to us as well.
- Regarding electronic filing and electronic
- 4 service, the Commission requires electronic filing of
- 5 documents for formal filings. In this proceeding, the
- 6 Commission will also require the filing of an original
- 7 and five paper copies for internal distribution. If
- 8 filings include information designated as confidential,
- 9 please file the original and five copies of fully
- 10 unredacted version -- of the fully unredacted version.
- 11 No paper copy is necessary for any partly redacted or
- 12 fully redacted version. Please file those versions only
- in electronic format.
- 14 Commission's rules provide for electronic
- 15 service of documents. The Commission will serve the
- 16 parties electronically and the parties will serve each
- 17 other electronically. When serving the parties, please
- 18 also send courtesy copies of the filings to Judge
- 19 Pearson and me.
- 20 Finally, we will get to the procedural
- 21 schedule. So we were given a proposed procedural
- 22 schedule prior to going on the record in this prehearing
- 23 conference. Is there a consensus on this proposal?
- MS. RACKNER: Yes.
- JUDGE DOROSHKIN: There is? Okay.

Page 8 This is Jennifer 1 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: 2 Cameron-Rulkowski and my understanding is this is an 3 agreed schedule. 4 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. Then, Ms. Cameron-Rulkowski, could you please read the 5 proposed schedule into the record? 6 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Certainly, Your 8 Settlement conference, April 22nd; response 9 testimony, June 10; circulation of joint issues matrix, June 13; settlement conference, June 20th; rebuttal and 10 cross-answering testimony, July 22nd. We have a 11 12 placeholder for a public comment hearing, date and location to be determined; filing of the joint issues 13

- 15 also July 26th; filing of cross-examination exhibits,
- 16 August 7; evidentiary hearing, August 14 and 15; initial

matrix, July 26th; discovery deadline, July twenty --

- 17 briefs, September 26th; reply briefs, October 10th.
- 18 And that's the substantive portion of the
- 19 procedural schedule, and I would be happy to email a
- 20 copy of this to -- to both of you.

- JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. Please do so.
- Regarding the public comment hearing, so WAC
- 23 480-90-197 requires the prehearing conference order to
- 24 address the timing, location, and amount of notice to
- 25 the public or customers of the public comment hearing.

- 1 If the date and address of the public comment hearing is
- 2 not yet determined, as it is not here, the parties will
- 3 need to submit notice of -- to the Commission of the
- 4 date, time, and address of the public comment hearing
- 5 when it is determined.
- 6 So we will note in the prehearing conference
- 7 order, unless the parties have any objections, the
- 8 following; that the public comment hearing will be held
- 9 before any hearing on the final disposition of the case,
- 10 that it will be held in Clark County, and that customers
- 11 will receive at least 30 days' notice of the public
- 12 comment hearing. And the notice will contain
- information required under WAC 480-90-197. Are there
- 14 any objections to those requirements in the prehearing
- 15 order?
- Okay. Under WAC 480-07-461(b), the deadline
- 17 for filing errata sheets to exhibits may be established
- 18 in the prehearing conference order. Are there any party
- 19 objections to setting the deadline a week prior to the
- 20 evidentiary hearing?
- MS. RACKNER: Nothing.
- JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. We'll incorporate
- 23 that into the prehearing conference order as well. So
- 24 including the errata filing deadline, we will
- 25 incorporate the parties' proposed schedule into the

Page 10 prehearing conference order. 2 All right. Is there anything else that we 3 need to address today? 4 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Not from Staff, Your 5 Honors. MS. RACKNER: None here. 6 MS. SUETAKE: None from Public Counsel. 8 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Anything from the 9 representatives on the bridge line? 10 MR. BROOKS: Nothing for AWEC. 11 Nothing for Energy Project. MR. FFITCH: 12 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. Then we'll issue an 13 order shortly containing the procedural schedule and the 14 other guidelines for the disposition of the case that we 15 discussed here.
