**RE: Compliance with Order 07, Docket UE-111190
Schedule 91—Surcharge to Fund Low Income Bill Assistance Program**


Dear Mr. King:

Pacific Power & Light Company, a division of PacifiCorp (Company) submits this letter in compliance with Order 07 in docket UE-111190. In Order 07 the Commission approved a settlement stipulation that included a Five-Year Plan for the Company's Low Income Bill Assistance (LIBA) program. One provision of the Five-Year Plan for LIBA was for the Company to make a filing around May 1 each year, absent a pending general rate case, to reflect the increased funding requirements in Schedule 91, Surcharge to Fund Low Income Bill Assistance Program, specified in the stipulation. Specifically, the funding requirements for LIBA in this annual filing are to reflect the increase in agency compensation per client qualified and for the number of program participants, as set forth in the Five-Year Plan.

After review of the current collection levels in Schedule 91 and a forecast of expenditures based on the increases in agency compensation and number of program participants specified in the Five-Year Plan, the Company has determined that a rate change in Schedule 91 is not necessary at this time. The Company will re-evaluate the collection level for Schedule 91 following an order from the Commission in the Company's currently pending general rate case, docket UE-140762.

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
