#### TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

These rule making inquiries examine the Commission's rules relating to regulated electricity and natural gas companies. The Commission will review the rules for content and readability pursuant to Executive Order 97-02. The review will consider:

Need;

Clarity;

Coordination;

Effectiveness and

Intent and statutory

Cost and fairness.

Efficiency;

authority;

The review also will consider whether substantive changes or additions are appropriate for electricity and natural gas regulation, including, but not limited to, the following subjects:

- consumer protection and information;
- accounting, finance, and least cost planning;
- electricity and natural gas safety, metering, and standards.

#### Our ultimate objective is to propose rules that:

- 1. are clearly written, in plain English;
- 2. are understandable by all audiences;
- 3. are presented in a comprehensive, well organized, and informative document;
- 4. clearly state policies and procedures including memorializing those currently in effect;
- 5. facilitate voluntary compliance with the rules; and
- 6. clearly define the rights and responsibilities of consumers receiving service from regulated electricity and natural gas companies.

To achieve these objectives the team will need input and advice from a wide range of interested persons -- public involvement is extremely important to the Commission. Stakeholders, including members of the regulated electricity and natural gas industry, consumers, and other interested persons are encouraged to participate in all aspects of this rule making. Opportunities to participate include filing written comments and attending workshops.

#### WORKSHOP

NOTICE IS GIVEN That a workshop in these rule making proceedings has been scheduled for 9:30 a.m., Thursday, June 3, 1999. The first attachment to this letter is an Agenda for the June 3<sup>rd</sup> workshop. The workshop will be organized into several sessions so that persons interested only in certain topics may attend for part of the day.

#### **DISCUSSION PAPER**

Commission Staff has released the attached Discussion Paper addressing rules regulating the electricity and natural gas industries under review in these rule making proceedings. No rule drafting will begin until stakeholders have had an opportunity to express their views. The team believes that effective communication will best take place in an atmosphere of information sharing. Consistent with that belief, the Commission's rule making teams have drafted this discussion paper and is distributing it to stakeholders before the initial workshop.

The discussion paper presents a series of issues by general topic, by rule. The topics were identified by review of comments received from stakeholders and from the collective experience of Commission Staff working with the rules on a daily basis.

The discussion paper is intended as a tool:

- to notify stakeholders of the topics;
- to allow stakeholders to offer additional comments; and
- to stimulate and focus discussion at the first workshop.

We recognize that the discussion paper is a lengthy document, but please review it carefully and provide comments on its content, either in writing or at the workshop. The rule making team will analyze comments received and use them to inform and guide us during the remainder of the rule making process.

- Should a customer be allowed the same length of time to pay back a delayed bill as it took the company to generate the bill? (Staff)
- Should 480-90/100-072(3) and (4) be revised, or perhaps deleted, along with all references to the winter moratorium? (Cascade/NWN)

#### WAC 480-90-081 Service Connections

• What is the "point of delivery" that delineates the responsibility of the customer and the gas

- company to furnish, install and maintain the piping and fittings. Is it at the meter, the entrance to the building, or some other point? (Staff)
- Assuming that outside piping and fittings are beyond the point of delivery, ie. pipes to a second building on same meter, should the utility be required or allowed, for a charge, to maintain the outside piping and fittings? (Staff)

# WAC 480-90-086; WAC 480-100-081; WAC 480-90/100-091 Service Entrance, Service Entrance Facilities, and Access to Premises

• Should language be included to require companies to restore private property to its original condition? (Staff)

#### WAC 480-90/100-096 Complaints and Disputes

- Should the term "complaint" be defined for the purposes of this rule? (Avista)
- Should a process be defined, including time frames, for a company to respond to and resolve
  consumer complaints received by the company by telephone, letters and/or electronic mail?
  (Staff)
- Should companies be required to provide interim updates during a commission complaint within a specific time frame? (Staff)

#### WAC 480-90-106; WAC 480-100-101 Form of Bills

- Should more or less detailed information be required on customer bills (e.g., units of
  measurement, cost per unit, tax percentages and amounts, mid-cycle billing rate changes)?
  (Cascade/Staff)
- Should the number of consecutive estimated meter reading billings be limited? (Staff)
- Should the rules continue to require that "bills for utility service shall be issued at intervals not to exceed two months"? (Cascade/PSE)

#### WAC 480-100/90-031 Accounting

- Can the rule be organized better by splitting it into two rules, one on accounting systems, the other on reporting requirements? (Staff)
- The rule prescribes use of the FERC Uniform System of Accounts. Does this imply the rule automatically adopts changes made by FERC to the Uniform System of Accounts (USofA)? (Staff)
- Is section (4) (electric rule) concerning variance from FERC accounts, necessary? (PSE)
- Does section (4) refer to departures from the FERC USofA and the need for a commission order to do so? (Staff)
- Should this Commission's deviations from FERC USofA be incorporated into rules (i.e. AFUDC, tax normalization, etc.)? (Staff)
- Must the rule refine or adopt FERC definitions of large and small utilities? (Staff)
- Should the rule define "results of operations" as used in the rule? (Staff)
- The FERC Annual reports are prescribed. Should additional data not specified in the FERC form be required? (Staff)
- How are "acceptable allocation methods" determined? Must a utility submit its allocation method as a part of an annual report? (Staff)
- Is the "Commission Basis" report necessary on a semi-annual basis? What type of adjustments to the "Commission Basis" report are required? If filed only once per year, which annual time period is best? (PSE, Avista, Staff)
- Can the reporting requirements of the state commission and federal agencies be coordinated for content and timing? (PSE)
- Is the report of monthly actual results necessary and useful? Should quarterly reporting be adopted? Can this report be eliminated entirely? (PSE, Avista, Staff)
- To obtain other data must the Commission formally order the utilities to submit a report or is a Secretary's letter sufficient? (Staff)
- Is the clause on annual budgets properly placed in this rule? Is it necessary? (PSE, Avista, Staff)

#### WAC 480-90/100-032 Accounting - Political Info. & Political Education Activities

• Should other "normally" disallowed costs be specifically identified in rule (i.e. charitable contributions or other Commission ordered costs) as not allowable for ratemaking purposes? (Staff)

#### WAC 480-90/100-043 Advertising

• Should rule be revised to specifically allow recovery of advertising costs which create ratepayer benefits which exceed the cost if the utility can demonstrate such benefits? (Cascade)

WAC 480-90/100-181/211 Filing of Records and Reports and the Preservation of Records

• Is the NARUC publication Regulations to Govern the Preservation of Records of Gas, Electric, and Water Companies the appropriate guide for the preservation of records or is there a more appropriate FERC guide? (Staff)

• Is it now appropriate to establish by rule some of the requirements that Staff and the Companies reached agreement on during negotiation of those tariffs. (Staff)

#### WAC 480-100-086 Meter Location

- Should companies be required to install meters away from windows, doors or overhangs for safety reasons? (Staff)
- Is locating a meter free from vibration an issue? (Staff)

#### WAC 480-100-121 Meter Charges

• If more than one meter is installed at the customer's request should the customer be billed the cost of the additional meter(s)? (Avista)

#### WAC 480-100-126; WAC 480-100-156 Meter Reading, and Multiplier and Test Constants

• Should we combine this rule governing how meter test procedures are to be established (480-100-176) with other rules covering accuracy of test standards (480-100-201) and portable indicating instruments (480-100-161)? (Staff)

#### WAC 480-100-181 Meter History Records

• Should we modify the rule regarding keeping of meter history records for clarity only or are there other reasons to modify this rule? (Staff)

#### **Gas Metering Rules:**

#### WAC 480-90-126 Meter Reading

- Do electronic meter readings still show the readings on them for the customer's benefit? If not should the rule address this? (Staff)
- What is the real intent of this rule? Is the intent for the customer to be able to read his own meter or to be able to verify the bill received? (Staff)

#### WAC 480-90-131 Installation of Meter Set Assembly

- Is the language about flat rates still appropriate? (Staff)
- Should the rule be clarified to indicate that the cost of the meter is a capital investment and its cost properly included as part of the investment feasibility analysis. (Cascade)

#### WAC 480-90-136 Location of Meter Set Assembly

• Should the language be changed to be consistent with (or adopt) other standards for the location of meter set assemblies? (Staff)

#### WAC 480-90-146 Initial Accuracy of Meters

- Should this rule be combined with other rules pertaining to meters? (Staff)
- Should sealing devices still be required on all meters? (Staff)

#### **Electric Safety and Standards:**

#### Facility Safety Rule (Possible New Rule?)

• Should a rule be drafted to specify safety requirements for electric facilities? (Staff)

#### WAC 480-100-151 Instrument Transformers:

• Is there any reason that the allowable error specified in the current rule be changed to reflect updated technology or for other reasons? (Staff)

#### WAC 480-100-186 Standard Frequency

- Is it appropriate and/or practical for each utility to establish its own standard frequency for alternating current service? (Staff)
- The existing rule indicates that utilities are required to maintain the frequency within plus or minus 2 percent. Is this a reasonable range.? (Staff)
- Is it appropriate to address the issue of permissible frequency variation with regard to a time element or the issue of harmonics? (Staff)

#### WAC 480-100-206 Reports of Accidents

• Should additional information be reported and should the rule specify a time line for reports as well? (Staff)

#### **WAC 480-100-161 Portable Indicating Instruments:**

• Should we consider combining the rule on portable indicating instruments (480-100-161) with the rule defining the accuracy of test standards (480-100-201) since they both refer to meter testing instruments and the reference standards against which these are calibrated? (Staff)

 Additionally, should the accuracy levels identified in the rules be modified to address updated technology or other reasons? (Staff)

#### WAC 480-100-191 Standard Voltage and Permissible Variation

- Should we rewrite the current rule to clarify language only or should we make substantive changes addressing such things as: (Staff)
  - a) A different standard for permissible voltage variation (higher or lower than the current plus or minus 5 percent)?
  - b) Stricter requirements for voltage spikes and sags (transients) recognizing more sensitive customer equipment now than when the rule was first written?
  - c) Specific requirements for customer induced fluctuations considered allowable?
  - d) Specification of standard voltages rather than allowing utilities to adopt standard service voltages?
- Should we carve off some of the voltage transient issues and address them in a separate reliability rule? (Staff)

#### **Gas Safety and Standards:**

#### WAC 480-90-101 Quality of Gas

- Should the terms quality of gas, calorimeter, heat content, and heat value be defined? And should they be defined in the rule or in the glossary section WAC 480-90-21? (Staff)
- Was section (5) Odorizing gases included to address the need to odorize propane and butane tanks? If that was the intent, does adding odorant affect the heat content of the fuel? (Staff)
- If the intent of adding section (5) Odorizing gases was to address safety concerns, should this section be moved to somewhere else? Should the language of this section be amended to mimic the odorization requirement under the Federal Code? (Staff)
- Does the Fire Marshall's office have overlapping jurisdiction with liquified petroleum gas? (Staff)

## WAC 480-90-211; WAC 480-100-311 Payment Agencies

- Should the rule specify requirements for location of business offices and payment agencies?
   (Staff)
- Should companies be required to notify customers of payment agency closures? (Staff)
