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Page 4 May 16, 2024 1 2. -000-3 4 JUDGE THOMPSON: Good morning. Let's be on 5 the record. We're here today for a prehearing conference in Docket UG-240008. This case is captioned Washington 6 Utilities and Transportation Commission versus Cascade 8 Natural Gas Corporation. This is a general rate case 9 filed by Cascade Natural Gas Corporation or Cascade. 10 My name is Connor Thompson. I am an 11 administrative law judge with the commission, and I will 12 be presiding in this matter along with the commissioners. The commissioners will not be joining us at this 13 prehearing conference. 14 15 Let's go ahead and get started by taking 16 appearances, beginning with Cascade. 17 ATTORNEY BARNETT: Good morning. Barnett for Cascade with Perkins Coie, and I'll be lead 18 19 counsel for Cascade on this matter. But joining me is 20 co-counsel Sherree Strong Carson and Megan Lin. And we filed notice of appearances for all of us. 21 22 JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you. 2.3 Staff? 24 ATTORNEY JONES: Good morning, your Honor. 25 My name is Josephine Strauss. I'm an assistant attorney

- 1 general with the Washington State Attorney General's
- 2 Office. I'll be representing staff in this matter. My
- 3 co-counsel will be Liam Weiland, although he is not here
- 4 today.
- 5 JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.
- 6 And for public counsel?
- 7 ATTORNEY O'NEILL: My name is Tad Robinson
- 8 O'Neill. I'm an assistant attorney general representing
- 9 public counsel. I will be joined by another attorney
- 10 later in the proceedings, but nobody else is here today.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Great. Thank you.
- 12 And for AWEC?
- 13 ATTORNEY BROOKS: Good morning. My name is
- 14 Tommy Brooks from the firm Cable Huston, representing the
- 15 Alliance of Western Energy Consumers. Appearing with me
- 16 too is Chad Stokes, who's not present. And he will be
- 17 lead counsel in the matter.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.
- 19 And for The Energy Project?
- 20 ATTORNEY ZAKAI: Good morning. My full name
- 21 is Yochanan Zakai. I go by Yochi. My pronouns are
- 22 he/him. And my firm is Shute, Mihaley & Weinberger. And
- 23 I'm here today on behalf of The Energy Project. And in
- 24 my petition to intervene is my full contact information,
- 25 and those individuals from my firm that we requested to

- 1 be on the service list.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Wonderful. Thank you.
- 3 And let me ask, are there any other
- 4 organizations on the call that want to give a verbal
- 5 notice of appearance here?
- 6 Okay. Hearing none, we have two petitions
- 7 to intervene that have been filed in writing. I've
- 8 reviewed both of those petitions for The Energy Project
- 9 and for AWEC. Are there any objections to any of the
- 10 petitions?
- 11 Okay. Hearing none, they are granted.
- 12 The procedural schedule, before today's
- 13 conference call, I received a suggested schedule from the
- 14 company, and I understand that the parties have all
- 15 agreed to that schedule. Is that correct?
- Okay. I see heads nodding. Wonderful.
- 17 Okay. Thank you.
- 18 I do have one -- let me pull up the
- 19 schedule. One question for the parties. We have the
- 20 public comment hearing as down for Monday, December 9.
- 21 Is there any objection to moving that to somewhere in the
- 22 middle of the week, either Tuesday, Wednesday, or
- 23 Thursday?
- 24 And I can give everybody a moment to look
- 25 at their calendars so that they can provide an answer.

- 1 If anybody knows right off the bat that those days will
- 2 not work, please go ahead and feel free to speak up. But
- 3 I'll give you a moment, and then I'll run through
- 4 everybody and ask if that would be a problem.
- 5 Okay. And having given some time to look
- 6 at the calendars, does the company have an issue with
- 7 moving the public comment hearing to either Tuesday,
- 8 Wednesday, or Thursday of that week? 9 ATTORNEY BARNETT: Sorry. No issue.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. Staff?
- 10 ATTORNEY STRAUSS: No issue, your Honor.
- 11 JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. Public counsel?
- 12 ATTORNEY O'NEILL: We're available all
- 13 three days.
- 14 JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. Wonderful. AWEC?
- 15 ATTORNEY BROOKS: No issue with that.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: All right. Great. And
- 17 The Energy Project?
- 18 ATTORNEY ZAKAI: No issue.
- 19 JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. And then in the
- 20 e-mail, there was also the possibility to move up the
- 21 date of the simultaneous reply briefs.
- Generally, right now, on general rate
- 23 cases, we do have two LJ's assigned to those. We do not
- 24 have two in this case. I'm presiding on my own for the
- 25 time being. And so if there's no objection, I likely

- 1 will move up the simultaneous reply brief date.
- 2 But I wanted to hear from the parties just
- 3 to confirm that there was no objection to that. Is that
- 4 -- I understand that's okay with the company,
- 5 Ms. Barnett?
- 6 ATTORNEY BARNETT: Yes. Either date is
- 7 fine with the company. And hopefully the reply brief
- 8 itself will help streamline things and make it easier for
- 9 your review. But no problem either date.
- 10 JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. Wonderful.
- 11 And does staff have any objection?
- 12 ATTORNEY STRAUSS: No objection, your
- 13 Honor.
- 14 JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. And public
- 15 counsel?
- 16 ATTORNEY O'NEILL: No, no objection.
- 17 JUDGE THOMPSON: Great. And AWEC?
- 18 ATTORNEY BROOKS: No objection.
- 19 JUDGE THOMPSON: And how about The Energy
- 20 Project?
- 21 ATTORNEY ZAKAI: No objection.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. Wonderful. I'll
- 23 give that a little bit of thought before issuing the
- 24 prehearing conference order. But I just wanted to
- 25 confirm that everybody would be okay with moving that

- 1 date up. And I will talk to my colleagues in ALD and see
- 2 if there may be some changes so that we can keep that
- 3 date where it is if possible.
- 4 Okay. With that, I think all of the other
- 5 dates look good to me. And I think that that will work
- 6 for the commissioners as well. So we'll go ahead and
- 7 incorporate that into the prehearing conference order.
- 8 The commission has approved the extended
- 9 agreement for intervenor funding in Docket U-210595.
- 10 Following the terms of the extended agreement, any
- 11 notices of intent to seek funding and request for case
- 12 certification were due today.
- The deadline for proposed budgets will be
- 14 30 days from today.
- We have received notices of intent to seek
- 16 funding from both AWEC and The Energy Project. I plan to
- 17 rule orally on the record today that AWEC and TEP are
- 18 case certified, and that they must submit any proposed
- 19 budgets within 30 days.
- 20 Do the parties have any concerns or
- 21 questions that they would like to raise right now?
- Okay. Wonderful. Let's go ahead and talk
- 23 about data requests really quick. If the parties have
- 24 discovery disputes, they should attempt to work those out
- 25 in good faith. But if they cannot, then they should

- 1 bring any motions to the commission for resolution. I
- 2 would encourage any party to pick up the phone or have a
- 3 Zoom call with opposing counsel before filing a motion to
- 4 compel or a motion to strike testimony.
- 5 I also want to address some specific
- 6 issues regarding discovery. We intend to adopt the same
- 7 requirements for identifying data requests as in the
- 8 Avista general rate case, and has been as been adopted in
- 9 the PSE general rate case as well. Those are first, the
- 10 parties agree to identify each data request by subject
- 11 above each data request in the cover letter and in the
- 12 distribution e-mail.
- Data requests propounded in a single set
- 14 will be grouped by subject in the cover letter and
- 15 distribution e-mail.
- The parties will cooperate to develop a
- 17 uniform list of subjects to facilitate discovery
- 18 tracking.
- Does anybody have any objections to
- 20 that?
- Okay. Hearing none, I am also aware that
- 22 the parties often request that any data requests and
- 23 responses are shared with every other party. It would
- 24 make this easier on the parties by including such a
- 25 requirement in the prehearing conference order. Is there

- 1 any objection to my including that requirement?
- Okay. Hearing none, that takes care of
- 3 that.
- 4 I will remind the parties that the
- 5 commission has already entered a protective order in this
- 6 docket. Do we have any need for amendments to the
- 7 protective order, any need for highly confidential
- 8 protective orders that is not covered in the protective
- 9 order that's on file?
- 10 ATTORNEY BARNETT: Not at this time, your
- Honor.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. Thank you.
- The commission requires electronic filing
- 14 of documents for formal filings.
- 15 We will also be requiring the parties to
- 16 submit five paper copies of testimony, exhibits, and
- 17 briefs within two business days of electronically filing
- 18 these same documents. As in the Avista general rate
- 19 case, we will exempt spreadsheets or models that would
- 20 exceed five pages.
- 21 Also, the commission's rules provide for
- 22 electronic service of documents. The commission will
- 23 serve the parties electronically, and the parties will
- 24 serve each other electronically.
- 25 If any party has not designated a lead

- 1 representative for service, which I think that you all
- 2 have, please do so via e-mail to me at Connor --
- 3 C-O-N-N-O-R -- thompson@utc.wa.gov.
- 4 Also, if anyone would like to add names or
- 5 e-mail addresses of other representatives that are
- 6 support staff who would like to receive electronic
- 7 courtesy copies, please let me know at that e-mail as
- 8 well.
- 9 Finally, looking at the procedural
- 10 schedule submitted by the parties, let's talk about
- 11 errata sheets. I see that our discovery deadline lines
- 12 up about a week before. Would the parties have any
- 13 objection to the deadline for errata sheets to exhibits
- 14 being a week prior to the evidentiary hearing as well?
- 15 ATTORNEY BARNETT: No objection.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. Is there anything
- 17 else we need to address today?
- No? Okay. Hearing none, I will issue an
- 19 order shortly containing the procedural schedule and
- 20 other quidelines for the disposition of this case.
- 21 We are adjourned. Thank you, and have a
- 22 great morning and rest of your day.
