PUGET SOUND ENERGY'S MOTION TO EXTEND SUSPENSION DATE

	I. INTRODUCTION
1.	In light of the unprecedented global health crisis associated with the
	coronavirus (COVID-19), Puget Sound Energy ("PSE") offers, and hereby agrees,
	to waive the statutory deadline (tariff suspension date) in this case for up to 60
	days, from May 20, 2020 until July 20, 2020. Extending the tariff suspension date
	would delay the implementation of any rate increases for customers and provide
	the Commission with additional time to issue a Final Order to the extent there are
	any Commission delays or disruptions associated with the effects of the
	coronavirus (COVID-19).
	II. BACKGROUND AND ARGUMENT
2.	PSE filed this general rate case on June 20, 2019, which triggered a tariff
	suspension date of May 20, 2020.1 The case is nearing its final stages. A hearing
	was conducted on February 6, 2020, and the parties are in the process of
	completing post-hearing briefing.
3.	In recent weeks, the coronavirus (COVID-19) has caused an
	unprecedented global health crisis causing federal, state and local leaders to issue
	quarantine and social distancing orders impacting nearly all aspects of society,
	including the closure of schools, workplaces, transportation, restaurants and more.
	The impact upon residents and businesses within PSE's service territory has been
	particularly severe. Federal, state and local officials expect the impact of the
	coronavirus (COVID-19) to last for several weeks or more.

1	4.	Given the unprecedented impacts of the coronavirus (COVID-19), PSE is
2		notifying the Commission and parties that it will waive the statutory deadline and
3		extend the tariff suspension date in this case up to July 20, 2020, including the
4		implementation of any new rate relief granted in this case. PSE believes extending
5		the tariff suspension date would help mitigate any rate increases on customers and
6		would extend the time period for the Commission to issue a Final Order, which
7		may be beneficial to the Commission, to the extent there are any disruptions or
8		delays to Commission operations during this time.
9		III. CONCLUSION
10	5.	For the reasons set forth above, PSE hereby provides notice that it will
11		waive the statutory deadline and extend the tariff suspension date in this case up
12		to 60 days—to July 20, 2020.
