- PROCEEDINGS: On March 30, 2005, Avista Corporation d/b/a Avista Utilities (Avista or the Company) filed certain tariff revisions to its currently effective Tariff WNU-28 and Tariff WN U-29 designed to effect a general rate increase in its electric service (UE-050482) and gas service (UG-050483) in Washington. The proposed revisions provide for general rate increases of 11.4 percent for the electric tariffs and 1.7 percent for the gas tariffs. The Commission, by Order No. 01, suspended the operation of the general tariff revisions and consolidated the dockets for hearing.
- PARTY REPRESENTATIVES: David J. Meyer, Avista VP and Chief Counsel, Spokane, Washington, represents the Company. Edward A. Finklea and Chad M. Stokes, Cable Huston Benedict Haagensen & Lloyd LLP, Portland, Oregon, represent Northwest Industrial Gas Users (NWIGU). S. Bradley Van Cleve and Matthew W. Perkins, Davison Van Cleve P. C., Portland, Oregon, represent Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities (ICNU). Ronald L. Roseman, attorney, Seattle, Washington, represents the Energy Project. Simon J. ffitch, Assistant Attorney General, Seattle, Washington, represents the Public Counsel Section of the Washington Office of Attorney General. Gregory J. Trautman and

Christopher Swanson, Assistant Attorneys General, Olympia, Washington, represent the Commission's regulatory staff ("Commission Staff or Staff").¹ Contact information provided at the conference for the parties' representatives is attached as Appendix A to this Order.

- 3 **PETITIONS TO INTERVENE.** The following persons filed petitions to intervene or petitioned orally at the prehearing conference for intervenor status:
 - 1. Northwest Industrial Gas Users
 - 2. Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities
 - 3. Energy Project² (petitioned orally).

No objection was heard to any of these petitions. The Commission finds that each of these petitioners has established a substantial interest in this proceeding and that their participation will be in the public interest. These petitions to intervene are granted.

- DISCOVERY; PROTECTIVE ORDER: The parties initiated discovery prior to the prehearing conference. Discovery will continue pursuant to the Commission's discovery rules, WAC 480-07-400—425. The Commission urges the parties to continue to work cooperatively together to avoid having to bring discovery matters forward for formal resolution.
- Avista requests that the Commission enter its standard form of protective order with provisions for handling information and documents that parties may

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¹ In formal proceedings, such as this case, the Commission's regulatory staff functions as an independent party with the same rights, privileges, and responsibilities as any other party to the proceeding. designate as "confidential" consistent with the terms of such order and the Commission's procedural rules. WAC 480-07-420 and -423. The Commission will enter a protective order in this proceeding to facilitate the filing and exchange among parties, during discovery and otherwise, of information that is deemed confidential by the party in whose custody and control the information is held.

- PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE: The Commission establishes the procedural schedule that is attached to this Order as Appendix B, which is incorporated into the body of this Order by this reference.
- ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION. The Commission supports the informal settlement of matters before it. The parties in this proceeding have scheduled settlement conferences within the procedural schedule. If parties need the services of a settlement judge, please call the Director, Administrative Law Division, at 360-664-1142.
- FILING; COPIES OF MATERIALS: Parties must submit an original and 16 copies of all documents filed. All paper copies of filed documents must be mailed to the Commission Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250, or delivered by hand to the Commission's Records Center at the agency's physical address. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by U.S. Postal Service.
- Paper copies of filed materials are required to conform to the format and publication guidelines set forth in WAC 480-07-395 and 480-07-460, and must be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.

An electronic copy of all filings is required. Electronic copies may be provided by e-mail delivery to <<u>records@wutc.wa.gov</u>>. Alternatively, Parties may furnish an electronic copy by delivering with each filing a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette including the filed document(s).

The Commission prefers that parties furnish electronic copies of all filings that do not include confidential information and unredacted versions of documents that do include confidential information in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format, supplemented by a separate file in MS Word 6.0 (or later), or WordPerfect 5.1 (or later) format. Electronic documents that are redacted versions that mask confidential information, should be filed exclusively in "read-only" .pdf format. Parties are required to organize and identify electronic files as specified in WAC 480-07-140(5).

NOTICE TO PARTIES: Any objection to the provisions of this Order must be filed within ten (10) days after the service date of this Order, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review.
