- On June 28, 2005, the Commission assessed penalties upon Excel Telecommunications, Inc. (also referred to herein as "Excel" or "Respondent") in the amount of \$2,600.00, alleging 26 violations of WAC 480-120-166, which requires telecommunication companies to: 1) report the results of its investigation of service-affecting informal complaints to Commission staff within two business days from the date Commission staff passes the complaint; 2) report the results of non-service-affecting informal complaints to Commission staff within five business days from the date the Commission staff passes the complaint; and, 3) to respond to requests from Commission staff for additional information on pending complaints within three days.
- 2 On July 21, 2005, Excel Telecommunications, Inc. filed with the Commission an Application for Mitigation of Penalties. Excels asks that the Commission dismiss and/or waive the penalties assessed against the Company or significantly reduce the assessment.
- 3 On August 10, 2005, Commission Staff filed its response to Excel's Application for Mitigation. Commission Staff recommends and supports mitigating \$800.00 of the penalties assessed against Excel and requests that the Commission deny any further mitigation of penalties.

- ⁴ The Administrative Procedure Act¹ and the Commission's rules of practice and procedure² both provide the opportunity for a brief adjudication to allow the consideration of petitions for mitigation of penalties. It appears that the Staff response to application for mitigation and the Respondent's consideration of its mitigation petition will both be best-served by invoking the relatively informal processes relating to brief adjudications, considering agreed evidence without need for an oral hearing, and allowing parties the opportunity to present oral argument.
- ⁵ Pursuant to RCW 34.05.482 and WAC 480-07-610, the Commission determines that a brief adjudicative proceeding is appropriate for resolving the issues that are raised in the penalty assessment.
- 6 The statutes and rules involved in this proceeding include chapter 34.05 RCW, chapter 480-07 WAC and WAC 480-120-166.

Parties should bring any other documents that they want the presiding officer to consider to the brief adjudicative proceeding on Wednesday, September 7, 2005.
