RE: Docket UE-231031 Puget Sound Energy's Electric Tariff Revision

As an employee owner of Sunergy Systems, a solar installation company in Seattle, I want to say that I am in support of Puge Sound Energy's revised tariff filing of January 18, 2024.

Current regulation says that there is a minimum net metering requirement of four percent based on the highest demand in 1996. Again, this is a minimum requirement and not a maximum. PSE's proposed extension of schedule 150 is a temporary proposal to maintain the current regulatory status so that a Value of Solar Study can be conducted before making any changes. This study will be a valuable guide for future work and determining a successor tariff that is fair and equitable.

For those of us in the solar industry, it is very vital for us to be able to confidently assure potential customers that net metering will be there for them once their installation is complete. This is important to me particularly because it is necessary for the health of our small business, it affects my livelihood (along with those of my family, fellow employee owners, and other local solar installation companies), and because I am dedicated to the growth of green energy and protecting our planet.

Please approve PSE's Schedule 150, regarding Net Metering.
