NOTICE OF WORKSHOP (Set for May 5, 2022, from 8:30 a.m. – 12 p.m.)

Re: Relating to possible changes to Tariff 15-C, Consolidated Dockets TV-210535 & TV-210812

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

On July 2, 2021, Clutter, Inc. filed with the Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a petition to revise Tariff 15-C in Docket TV-210535. On October 11, 2021, the Washington Movers Conference filed a petition to revise Tariff 15-C in Docket TV-210812.

On February 22, 2022, the Commission issued a Notice of Consolidation for Dockets TV-210535 and TV-210812, as well as a Notice of Opportunity to Submit Written Comments. The Commission sought stakeholder input to inform its inquiry, including general comments related to the scope and purpose of possible tariff revisions, requesting comments and responses to questions provided in the notice.

The Commission will hold a virtual technical workshop for these matters on **May 5, 2022, from 8:30 a.m. to 12 p.m**. The workshop will address the following:

- Tariff 15-C Item 100 what requirements should the Commission implement related to (1) the maximum length of time for storage-in-transit, (2) when permanent storage should begin and end, and (3) liability?
- Tariff 15-C Item 102(5) should the Commission require companies to make a separate contract for small goods transportation services or is a bill of lading sufficient?

- Tariff 15-C Item 230(2) should the Commission require companies to bill in 15-minute increments or bill for actual time?
- Tariff 15-C Item 230(7)(a)(ii) should the Commission modify the minimum number of hours carriers are required to charge for moves performed after hours, on weekends, or on state-recognized holidays?
- Tariff 15-C Maximum Band Rates should the maximum rate band be removed or adjusted?
- Tariff 15-C Minimum Band Rates alternatively, should the minimum rate band be removed or adjusted?
