**BACKGROUND**

- 1 On May 1, 2006, Resource Recovery Corp. (Resource or the Company) filed with the Commission a petition requesting an extension of time to file its 2005 annual report as required by WAC 480-70-071. The Company stated it was unable to prepare the report due to a burst sprinkler pipe and resultant disruption. The Company sought an extension until May 8, 2006.
  
- 2 A review of Commission records reveals the Company filed its annual report on the May 1, 2006, due date, and the sought for extension is now unnecessary.

**FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS**

- 3 (1) The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the State of Washington vested by statute with the authority to regulate public service companies, including solid waste companies. *RCW 80.01.040; Chapter 81.04 RCW; Chapter 81.28 RCW and Chapter 81.77 RCW.*
  
- 4 (2) Resource is a solid waste company and is a public service company subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission.
  
- 5 (3) Resource is subject to the provisions of RCW 81.04.080 and WAC 480-70-071 requiring solid waste companies to file an annual report by May 1 of each year.
  
- 6 (4) This matter was brought before the Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting on May 17, 2006.

- 7 (5) After review of the petition filed in Docket TG-060696 by Resource and acknowledging that the Company filed its annual report on May 1, 2006, the Commission dismisses the petition as being moot.

**O R D E R**

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 8 (1) The petition by Resource Recovery Corp. seeking an extension until June 1, 2006, to file its 2005 annual report is dismissed.

The Commissioners, having determined this Order to be consistent with the public interest, directed the Secretary to enter this Order.
