Background

The Company's Washington Schedule 135, Net Metering Services (Schedule 135) contains provisions governing PacifiCorp's participation in the incentive program. PacifiCorp proposes to modify Schedule 135 to address relevant revisions to WAC 458-20-273. PacifiCorp proposes the following tariff changes:

- The annual limitation for incentive payments to one payee will increase from \$2,000 to \$5,000;
- New community solar projects will be eligible for the incentive payment program; and
- The formula used to determine incentive payments for community solar projects will be modified.

The purpose of this filing is to update Schedule 135 – Net Metering Service to incorporate these changes.


The purpose of this filing is to update Schedule 135 – Net Metering Service to incorporate these changes.
