- On September 8, 2011, Gerald Munroe, d/b/a AAA Movers, (Gerald Munroe or Applicant), filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) an application requesting authority to operate as a household goods carrier in the state of Washington under RCW 81.80 and WAC 480-15. Gerald Munroe's application is incomplete as it lacks Support Statements from the community supporting his business as well as cargo insurance.
- On September 13, 2011, October 24, 2011 and December 5, 2011, the Commission sent Gerald Munroe notices to comply with the application requirements in RCW 81.80 and WAC 480.15. Gerald Munroe has not met these requirements as of the date of this Order.
- The application filed by Gerald Munroe in Docket TV-111644 should be dismissed for failure to meet the application requirements in RCW 81.80 and WAC 480-15.

## **ORDER**

- 4 **THE COMMISSION ORDERS** the application filed by Gerald Munroe, d/b/a AAA Movers, on September 8, 2011 in Docket TV-111644 for household goods carrier authority is dismissed.
- The Commission has delegated authority to the Secretary to enter this Order under RCW 80.01.030 and WAC 480-07-905(1)(k).

The Commission will schedule your request for review by issuing a notice of hearing to be held before an administrative law judge. The Commission, at its discretion, may consider your request for review in an adjudicative proceeding under RCW 34.05 Part IV, or in a brief adjudicative proceeding under RCW 34.05.482 through .494. Following hearing, the administrative law judge will enter an initial order. If you wish to seek review of the initial order, you may file a petition for administrative review under RCW 34.05.464, or if the matter is heard in a brief adjudicative proceeding, under RCW 34.05.491.

The Commission will grant a late-filed request for review only on a showing of good cause, including a satisfactory explanation of why the person did not timely file the request. A form for late-filed requests is available on the Commission's Web site.
