BACKGROUND	
On March 11, 2013, the Commission received a petition from East Side Van & Storage Co. (East Side) requesting an extension of 15 days to file its 2012 annual report as required by WAC 480-15-480(4).	
Commission Staff reviewed the request and recommended granting East Side's request for exemption, on condition that East Side must file its 2012 annual report no later than May 16, 2013.	
FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS	
(1) The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the State of Washington vested by statute with the authority to regulate public service companies, including household goods moving companies. RCW 80.01.040; Chapter 81.04 RCW; Chapter 81.28 RCW; and Chapter 81.80 RCW.	
(2) East Side is a household goods moving company and is a public service company subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission.	
East Side is subject to the provisions of RCW 81.04.080 and WAC 480-15-480 requiring household goods moving companies to file an annual report no later than May 1 of each year.	
· ·	s that the Commission may grant an exemption of doing so is consistent with the public interest.

7 (5) This matter was brought before the Commission at it s regularly scheduled meeting on April 25, 2013.

8 (6) After review of the petition filed in Docket TV-130358 by East Side on March 11, 2013, and giving due consideration, the Commission finds that the exemption is reasonable and should be granted.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 9 (1) The exemption sought by East Side Van & Storage Co. for an extension until May 16, 2013, to file its 2012 annual report is granted.
- 10 (2) Failure by East Side Van & Storage Co. to file its 2012 annual report by May 16, 2013, may result in the Commission invoking provisions of Chapter 81.04 RCW that provide for penalty assessments.
- 11 (3) The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and East Side Van & Storage Co. to effectuate the provisions of this Order.

The Commissioners, having determined this Order to be consistent with the public interest, directed the Secretary to enter this Order.
