LT Goldman provided me with 1810 as the time of death. After taking LT Goldman's statement I put up police tape around the scene and started a crime scene log.

The crime scene log was taken over by SGT Storment and I went to Father Bach at approximately 1905 hours to check if their security cameras recorded the incident, no one was available for assistance. I also went to the inter modal train station at approximately 1908 hours to see if they would have footage of the incident. Again, no one was available for assistance.

On 04/21/2016 at approx. 1801 hours I responded to 221 W. 1st on the report of a male on the train tracks possibly deceased.

Upon arrival I observed what appeared to be a white male laying just north of the third train track from the north, just above Browne St. The male appeared deceased. His body was still warm to the touch and there was no lividity. He appeared to have a large section of his left shoulder missing and was not breathing or moving.

Spokane Ladder #1, from Station arrived and pronounced the male deceased. See Officer E. Walker's narrative for further.

I observed the deceased males wallet was still in his left pants pocket. I removed the wallet and located an Idaho Driver's License. He was identified as Gary L. Drake DOB 06/24/1959.

I then contacted the complainant who works for BNSF. He stated the male was on the tracks when he arrived. The last train to come through on the tracks were two locomotives heading west bound. He then stated they did not report anything suspicious on the tracks.

I observed what appeared to be flesh and bone fragments on the tracks and around the tracks in a west direction away from the body. It appeared as though Gary had been struck by the train and some of his remains were carried in the west direction by the train.

On 042116, Officer Walker and I responded to 221 W. 1st (Intermodal train station) for DOA call. Dispatch advised that David called and said that a male appears dead from being hit by a train on the tracks above Browne and Sprague.

Upon arrival, I observed a white male, laying in between several lanes of railroad tracks. His head was closest to the track facing to the southwest and he was laying on his right side. It appeared that his left shoulder was badly injured with a portion of it ripped off and laying inside the same railroad track. There was fresh body parts, blood and bones leading to the west on the track, on the outside of the track and inside the track. There was also a white canister laying inside the same track that the male was laying next to.

I asked dispatch for medics to respond to check for any signs of life. I located a jacket that was directly to the north of the male. It was on the sidewalk next to the railroad tracks and appeared to have been removed and thrown on the ground. It checked the pockets of the jacket and located a book, paper towels, cigar and a Pepsi bottle. There was no identification in the jacket and no note was located.

I assisted in securing the scene with Officer Walker and Officer Quarles. Detective Turman arrived on scene and continued the investigation.

Officer Walker and I checked for cameras at Father Bach that is northeast of the House of Charity. They were closed for the day. We then checked the intermodal cameras and they were also closed for the day.

On April 21, 2016 at about 1815 hours I received a call at home from Sgt. Storment reference a death investigation at the Intermodal Depot located at 221 W. 1st. He requested I respond.

I arrived on scene at about 1840 hours. Sgt. Storment, Sgt. Bartlett, Cpl. Blessing, Officers Quarles, Huett, and Walker were on scene as well as several members of BNSF. A large area around the body had been secured with crime scene tape. Cpl. Blessing had taken photographs from outside of the scene.

I was told that a call was placed about a body found on the railroad tracks to the east of the Intermodal Depot. Officers responded as well as fire. Fire pronounced the male deceased at 1813 hours. Officer Quarles had removed the male's wallet from his back left pocket and located identification in the name of Gary Drake. He then placed the wallet back in the deceased's pocket. It appeared the male had been hit by a train that was traveling from the east to the west. There was clothing and miscellaneous items located to the north of the body on the sidewalk that possibly belonged to the victim. If so they had been placed there prior to him being struck by the train.

I entered the crime scene at 1848 hours and took several photographs. There were four sets of tracks that run east and west. The deceased was lying just to the north of the second set of tracks from the south to north. He was lying on his right side. He was dressed in blue jeans with a black belt, a black sweatshirt, and brown boots. He had an obvious injury to his left shoulder. There was body tissue and bone to the west of the deceased but nothing to the east. There was spatter on the tracks that appeared also to go from east to west. There was also a large portion of tissue and muscle to the west of the deceased right in the middle of the tracks. This appeared to be from the shoulder injury.

Several feet to the west well beyond any tissue or bone there was a small can of butane in the middle of the tracks. It was covered in a dirt film and appeared that it may have been at the location for quite some time. I did collect it as possible evidence.

I then placed a call to Jim Uttke with the Spokane County Medical Examiner's Office and requested his response.

I photographed the clothing and miscellaneous items. There were two coats, a book, and a soda bottle. The items were collected as possible evidence.

I met with BNSF employees Allen Dryer and Joshua Gore. The train that was traveling west had passed through the area at 1745 hours. The train was now in Marshall Washington. BNSF employees had been dispatched to inspect the train and see if the train was equipped with video surveillance cameras.

At 1922 hours Jim Uttke arrived on scene as well as Lilac City Transport. Uttke first collected all the bone and tissue fragments. We then examined the body and discovered that the victim's left arm was missing. However his left hand remained. He had what appeared to be grease transfer above his left eye and below his left ear. His clothing was absent any obvious grease or dirt transfer. The only items on his person were the above mentioned wallet that contained his Idaho identification, social security card, and miscellaneous items.

At 2001 hours the body was removed from the scene by Lilac City Transport and the scene was cleared.

On April 22, 2016 I spoke with and emailed Joshua Gore requesting any video evidence. Gore indicated that the video on the front of the train didn't capture anyone on or near the tracks but the video on the back of the train captured the victim who had apparently been struck.


