Hi Michael,

Graebel/Quality Movers, LLC and all other Graebel Van Lines entities ceased field operations on March 17, 2017 following a failed system conversion and the loss of financing. All of the physical assets of the company were liquidated at the direction of a secured creditor and to my knowledge the WA operating authority was not purchased by any other party. As of June 9th the liquidation was complete in WA and no employees remain.

However, I was informed at the end that the secured creditor expected a large shortfall leaving no funds to pay unsecured creditors. I hope this helps.
