GRADE CROSSING PROTECTIVE FUND 2017 – 2019 GRANT APPLICATION OPEN CALL FOR PROJECTS

The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (commission), through its Grade Crossing Protective Fund (GCPF), provides grants for projects that eliminate or mitigate public safety hazards at railroad crossings and along railroad rights-of-way in Washington State. Any public, private or non-profit entity may submit an application to the commission for a GCPF grant.

To apply for a grant to eliminate or mitigate a public safety hazard at a railroad crossing or along a railroad right-of-way, complete the following information and submit it and any attachments to the commission. If you are proposing a change to the warning devices at a public railroad crossing, complete the GCPF petition form.

<u>Please be sure to complete the entire form. Incomplete or missing information will delay</u> the grant review process.

The White Swan Branch Line's crossings at Lateral A, Barkes and Wesley Rd. are equipped with outdated and aging at grade electronic warning system with unnecessarily low visibility. All three roadways being crossed are classified as rural arterial roadways with average daily trips ranging from 2700 to 434 with 4 trains per week crossing. Lateral A Road is a HAZMET material transport route and both Lateral A Rd. and Wesley Rd. are classified as regional corridors. All three roads are used as bus routes for the surrounding school districts
A detailed summary of the proposed project and how it will eliminate or mitigate the hazard. Include any drawings or construction plans for the proposed project.
To improve visibly and reliability of our advance warning devices the County is proposing to retrofit the existing at grade warning signals with LED lighting at the Lateral A, Barkes and Wesley Road. crossings. LED lights are brighter, more efficient and operate at a lower temperature that what the County current has in place.
