Purpose: Assists in the implementation of programs and policies concerning solid waste handling and disposal, and reviews and comments on proposed changes to the Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan.

Membership: Comprised of ten representatives; one from each of the incorporated cities, the waste industry, tribal councils, Clallam County, state and federal agencies, private industry, agricultural community and one at-large. SWAC meetings are open to the public, though currently being held online only. Meeting links can be found at the top of the agenda posted above. Meetings are held the fourth Wednesday of the month at 3 pm in the Commissioner's Board Room at the Clallam County Courthouse. Clallam County Solid Waste Management Plan Update

The current Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan (CSWMP) was updated in 2014. The CSWMP reflects the current state of the local solid waste system and assists SWAC and other solid waste stakeholders in solid waste management activities such as making informed recommendations, obtaining solid waste handling permits, and qualifying for Ecology Local Solid Waste Financial Assistance funding or other financial assistance programs.

The cities and county, along with voluntary participation from tribes, are working on an update of the CSWMP to be completed
