Re: Inquiry to determine the appropriate process for clarifying whether Chapter 480-15 WAC allows household goods carriers to contract with third parties to provide services regulated by the Commission, Docket TV-210737, Comments of Public Counsel

The Public Counsel Unit of the Washington State Attorney General's Office ("Public Counsel") respectfully submits these comments in response to the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission's (the "Commission") November 16, 2021, Notice of Opportunity ("Notice") to Submit Written Comments in Docket TV-210737. The Commission opened Docket TV-210737 to determine the appropriate process for clarifying whether the existing household goods carrier rules allow household goods carriers to contract with third parties to provide services regulated by the Commission.

Public Counsel appreciates the opportunity to offer comments in this Docket. As stated in the Notice, the Commission opened this Docket after declining to enter a declaratory order in response to a petition from the Washington Movers Conference seeking a ruling on the role of third party contractors in the household goods moving industry (Docket TV-200348). In Docket TV-200348, Public Counsel responded to the petition for declaratory order and recommended that the Commission offer guidance and clarification through a policy docket or rulemaking. Our
