- On February 2, 2004, Qwest Corporation (Qwest) filed with the Commission, in accordance with the Commission's Ninth Supplemental Order in Docket No. UT-991358, a Petition to Terminate or Modify the Service Quality Performance Program effective as of December 31, 2003. In the alternative, Qwest requests modification of the Service Quality Performance Program to reflect the new retail service quality rules that became effective on July 1, 2003, and to correct certain flaws in the application of the existing Service Quality Performance Program payment structure. The Commission entered its Ninth Supplemental Order in this docket on June 19, 2000, approving and adopting the settlement agreements and granting the application. A copy of the petition is available on the Commission's website at www.wutc.wa.gov/991358.
- 2 The Commission will hear this matter pursuant to Part IV of chapter 34.05 RCW pertaining to adjudicative proceedings, including but not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Title 80 RCW, having legal authority to regulate the rates, services, and practices of public utilities. Statutes involved, in addition to those previously cited, include those within chapters 80.01 RCW, 80.04 RCW and 80.36 RCW. Rules involved include those within chapters 480-07 WAC and 480-120 WAC.

- The ultimate issues include whether the petition is just, fair, reasonable,
 sufficient, and in the public interest. In accordance with the provisions of RCW
 80.04.130, the burden of proof shall be upon Qwest, the Petitioner/Applicant.
- 4 NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That in accordance with WAC 480-07-440(1)(a), the Commission has determined that good cause exists for this matter to be heard on shortened notice.

In addition, notices of appearance must be filed with the Commission, as required by WAC 480-07-345(2), no later than the day prior to the conference. If any party or witness needs an interpreter or other assistance, please fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission. The time and place for the evidentiary hearings will be set at the prehearing conference or by later written notice.
- 8 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default in accordance with RCW 34.05.440. The parties are further advised that the sanction provisions of WAC 480-07-450 are specifically invoked.
