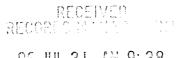

Verizon Northwest Inc. ("Verizon NW" or the "Company") submits the following reports in accordance with WAC 480-123-070 and WAC 480-123-080.

Report No. 1

WAC 480-123-070(1)(a) & (b) – Report on Use of Federal Funds and Benefits to Customers:

In 2005 Verizon NW in Washington received only Interstate Access Support ("IAS"), in the amount of \$19,139,104. These funds, along with other revenues, enabled the Company to continue to provide services at a level that meets the intent set forth in 47 U.S.C. §254. The amount and categories of investments made and expenses incurred by the Company in 2005 are set forth in its Annual Report filed with the Commission. For example, the Company added nearly \$86,000,000 in property, plant and equipment, including nearly \$40,000,000 in switching and circuit equipment and over \$31,000,000 in cable and wire facilities (see Schedule B-1 Total Washington). The Company incurred nearly \$90,000,000 in Plant Specific Expense, which relates directly to maintaining and operating its network in Washington, and it incurred over \$177,000,000 in depreciation expense to recover investments previously made in its network (see Schedule I-1).

These investments and expenditures generally benefit all customers receiving the IAS supported services from the Company within its designated service area.

Report No. 2

WAC 480-123-070(4) – Report on Complaints per One Thousand Lines:

Verizon NW reports that it is aware of 61 complaints made during 2005 to the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") and 98 complaints to the Washington Attorney General ("AG"). This corresponds to a number of complaints per 1,000 lines of approximately 0.21.

Of the 61 FCC complaints, only 4 were related to services supported by IAS. Three involved billing issues and were resolved, where warranted, by adjusting the customers' accounts. The other complaint involved being on hold when calling to check on an order, and was resolved with an apology for his wait during a period of unusually high call volumes; the customer cancelled his order.

The remaining 57 FCC complaints were not related to IAS supported services and dealt with DSL service, long distance service, other carriers' billing errors and repair. The majority of the complaints were resolved by making adjustments to the customer's account when a credit was due.

Of the 98 AG complaints, only 10 were related to IAS supported services. Most concerned payment, disconnection and collections issues and were resolved, where appropriate, by reconnections, payment arrangements and credits. One matter involved apparent identity theft and was resolved by notifying the collections agency of the fraud. Another concerned a move order that was denied in error; by the time the Company was able to contact the customer he had service with another provider.

The remaining 88 AG complaints were not related to services supported by IAS and dealt with DSL service, long distance service, and other carriers' provisioning errors. The majority of the complaints were resolved by making adjustments to the customer's account when a credit was due.

From October 1, 2006 through September 2007 Verizon NW will receive only Interstate Access Support. The Company will use these funds and other revenues to continue to provide services at a level that meets the intent set forth in 47 U.S.C. §254. The nature and magnitude of its investments and expenditures are anticipated to be similar to those for the prior period. They are expected to benefit customers generally by helping enable the Company to continue to provide good quality supported services.
